Hope Mountain Impact

Hope Mountain is a place, but it's much more than just a place. Hope Mountain is where God is doing great things in the lives of needy people in a multitude of ways. Here's a wonderful example:

A Salaam A Likum is an Arabic term meaning, "peace be with you." It's also the name of one of Hope Mountain's partners that ministers to M's and tribal people in Mindanao. Patrick and Shari Bailey are missionaries overseeing this unique ministry and have become good friends.

In June, the staff of A Salaam A Lalikum was asked by 25 Ba-



jao kids from Isla Verde and 40 from Santa Cruz if they could have a youth camp.

The Bajao tribe are the very poorest in all the Philippines, most being illiterate. They sell used clothing and pearls, and beg to make a living. Most of the Bajao are animist, they live in little houses located over raw sewage—their homes are without bathrooms or running water. The Baileys had been teaching among these young

people and Shari said, "the Bajao youth wanted to go to a quiet place where they could learn the Word of God that they kept hearing about. But there was no way they could afford to go to Hope Mountain for a youth camp, in fact, they couldn't afford to go anywhere!"

Shari shared how Hope Mountain made it possible for a youth camp to become a reality for these extremely needy kids: "For 2 hours of work a day, Hope Mountain was offered to them. They could sleep in a bed, the first time for many (most sleep on mats on bamboo floors). They were ELATED !!! They did have something to give ...their labor!!! And they offered it up to the Lord each day as thanksgiving for the BEAUTIFUL, QUIET place they were able to stay in. Not only did they work 2 hours a day, they worked up to 4 hours a day and were VERY grateful to the people at Hope Mountain who allowed them this opportunity to have an intensive study of God's Word and learn of His love for them and His plan for their salvation. They started at 5 am-they did gardening, cleaned up the grounds, cut food for the animals, cleaned rabbit cages and cleaned dormitory rooms. And they did their work with JOY and THANKS-GIVING!

While at Hope Mountain, the Bajao youth sat under the skillful Bible teaching of Pastor Melchor and other staff members of



A Salaam A Likum. In the quietness of this place, they were fed the Word of God and heard clearly the Gospel message. And during their stay they

were able to discuss and reflect upon what they had heard.

These precious Bajao youth were filled with joy as they understood

God's love and what Christ had done for them.

So what was the result of these three days? 23 of the 40 young people from Santa Cruz, who heard the Gospel for the first time, made the decision to commit their lives to Christ and to be baptized. In fact, when they left Hope Mountain,



In summing up these three days at Hope Mountain, Shari said, **"80 lives were transformed—65 youth and 15 staff members."** She went on to say, **"They are begging to go back next year!!!** Thank you, Hope Mountain for the unforgettable experiences and life-changing times these kids (and staff) had. In your beautiful, quiet facility these kids really heard the love of God in His Word.....and they will never be the same!!!"At the beach where they were baptized they wrote in the sand to the Hope Mountain staff, "THANK YOU!"

Partnering mission and other ministry groups will be gathering to present their ministries, do demonstrations, sell livelihood products and enable the larger Christian community and the public to see what God is doing in Mindanao. This festival also gives the various organizations and groups an opportunity to network with one another for expanded ministry in Mindanao. Pray that all the det ails will come together and that this will be a great blessing to all that will be involved. This is the first time this has been done. Pray that Bukid sa Paglaum will become an annual event that will contribute to the expansion of God's kingdom. Pray for Gloria as she coordinates this event.

■ Pray for numerous repair and renovation projects which are in progress or need to be started at Hope Mountain. The needs are never ending and there are always needs for workers and resources.

■ We're taking a **short vacation** (Sept. 13-19). Pray that we'll get some needed rest, we're pretty exhausted.
