





On May 1, 2009 Russell Barnes went home to be with his Lord and savior Jesus Christ. Barnes was born in 1933 in Marion, IN and was 77 years old. He is survived by his wife Elsie, daughters Linda DiStasio and Sandi Winnett, and son, Russ. There is also Mitzi, the white poodle who also still misses him.

"Frank" Barnes was known to his family and friends as a gentle giant who loved the Lord, his family, and friends. He spent time volunteering at churches, hospitals, "and never met a stranger." "He was the most honest person I have ever known", said Wendell Fisher, a child hood friend since the second grade and they remained friends until frank's death. "He never swore or drank. He lived a godly wholesome life." Fisher relocated to the Gulf coast in 1975.

It was in his high school years that Barnes developed a love for music with his friend Wendell. They were given an opportunity to play on the radio and his love for music stayed with him even after joining the air force and playing at churches around the country wherever he was stationed. At the time of his death he was music minister at Popp's Ferry Baptist Church.

He became a Ham radio operator and was given the call sign WA5FB. He worked in the civil defense office during hurricane Camille and when heart surgery in 2000 restricted his activities he worked from his patio in Biloxi, MS during hurricane Katrina.

Frank retired in 1977 in Biloxi and volunteered three days a week at the Keesler Medical Center and also taught special education at the Ocean Springs School District.

"He devoted his life to the service of the Lord and to his family," his wife of 57 years Elsie said. He believed in helping his neighbor and he was like someone you always knew. He was kindly and outgoing. Her husband always said he wanted a celebration at his funeral, and even though it was very difficult for his wife, children, grandchildren, and friends, they did their best to grant his wish. Four people gave eulogies and at the end Barnes' son and grandson used his instruments to play "I'll Fly Away."

Ron was a retired pastor and often would share a "mini sermon" for his turn at the mic. He liked to remind us that his call sign meant "Radio's Sweetest Sound."


He is missed by all of his ham friends who are confident that we will indeed meet again.




Ron Gallop and XYL Betty

Silent Key Kenneth Finch, W5TUM:

Kenneth G. Finch, W5TUM, 94 of Greenbrier, AR, passed away Friday, April 16, 2010. He was born in St. Paul, MN. Kenneth was a loving husband, father, and grandfather, a Navy veteran of WWII and member of Crosspoint Baptist Church of Greenbrier. Kenneth had worked for the St. Paul Police Dept., Chicago Northwestern Railroad and Virco, but is probably best known as the owner/operator of "Last Stop Fix-It" in Damascus, AR, where he repaired CB radios. He was a former Fire Chief for the Damascus Fire Dept., a HAM radio operator and member of ARRL, and a member of the Model Railroad Club. A daughter, Barbara McCoy Dempsey, grandson Noah Cunningham and two sisters also preceded him in death.

Those left to mourn his passing are his wife of 73 years Euna B. Hoagland Finch; sons: Terrance Finch and wife Judith of Rochester, MN and Gary Finch and wife Shawn of Greenbrier, AR; daughters: Sandra Conrad-McKim and husband Hurshel of Conway, AR, Donna Petroske and husband Leo of Big Lake, MN, Wanda Cunningham and husband Earl of Redvers, Saskatchewan, Canada, and Laura Finch-Moore and husband Bobby of Jacksonville, AR; seventeen grandchildren; twentynine great grandchildren; nine great-great grandchildren and a host extended family and friends.

Silent Key Rev. Kenneth Hardin, N8FHK:

Rev. Kenneth L. Hardin, age 94 of Farwell, went home to be with his Lord and Savior Friday, May 7, 2010. Kenneth was born on March 18, 1916 in Clinton, Illinois. He was united in marriage to Thelma Mae Hargis on March 31, 1937. Rev. Hardin was saved in 1931; he entered the ministry in 1936. Together he and Thelma ministered in Kentucky, Illinois, Indiana, California, Washington, Idaho and Michigan; they had resided in Michigan since 1953. During the years in Michigan they pastored in White Cloud, Boyne City, Marshall, Clare, St. Helen, Mt. Pleasant, and Assistant Pastored in Harrison. Field work for Rev. Hardin consisted of Seminars and Special Services. Rev. Hardin also served as Dean of Michigan Extension for Ridgedale Theological Seminary of Chattanooga, TN, later serving as Vice President and President Pro Tem. Rev.
