# God directed change makes waiting a good thing

Change is our most common companion. It's not always easy to handle, but some are pleasantly received. Take the change from January 10th when we



were shivering in the below-freezing temps, and Mr. & Mrs. Cardinal did the same at our snow capped bird feeder. Then just this morning I snapped the picture above of the daffodils that are blooming under the same feeder. Now there is a welcome sight! It is amazing what can change in seven weeks.

Since 1996, the Koronadal Blaan have had the complete New Testament to read, leading to a growing church. Still there's been need for another change—a way to make God's Word understandable to the many Blaans who do not read or struggle to read. God has answered with another welcome change.

In our last letter, we gave some wonderful details on the new audio Bible players that are arriving in the Philippines. These are still coming—about 50 we know of to date. We shared in that letter

about our up coming trip to the Philippines in July to help the Blaans with

using their new players in structured, group Bible studies.

As if that was not enough change, we have more good news in regard to the Blaan audio work. After several months of negotiation, we have received the 4 DVD master disks for the Koronadal Blaan New Testament audio. Having these DVD's is a direct answer to a prayer request we gave in our last letter. This is different from the Blaan Audio Bible, which is the spoken Word of God with dubbed background sounds that fit the passage being read. Examples are the sound of a raging sea and wind when Jesus calms the storm on Galilee. Another would be the sound of an angry crowd in Pontius Pilate's court when Jesus is being sent to the Cross.

The DVD masters are the recorded New Testament audio—word for word—without other sounds. Just like when you read God's word aloud. Why is this important? Having these audio files will make it possible to produce Blaan audio study books for children and adults using Scripture portions. This will further enhance the structured Bible studies in the Philippines. We can do this with the help of the Vernacular Media Department here at JAARS. More about these tools in future letters.

#### Haiti Ministry Trip

The week of February 6, I (Leon) went with 12 others to Haiti. We were known as "Team 60" from the North Carolina Baptist Men. We



were housed at the Samaritan's Purse compound about a 45 minute drive north of Port-au-Prince.



Very soon after landing in Port-au-Prince, the capital city, we began to see evidence of the earthquake with the many cracked walls and

piles of rubble—a year later. Then our host took us to see the mass grave where some 280,000 bodies are

buried. We just stood there, not really able to comprehend that number.

Jerry and Betty, a delightful couple, were the coordinators who welcomed us and began our orientation. Our



group was divided into three teams: two medical clinic teams and the construction team where I worked.

We built small temporary houses and most days could build two houses in the morning and two more in the afternoon. When each house was completed, the



family receiving it would be there for a short dedication service. They were presented with a Bible in Creole and some household items. We then sang songs, and a dedication prayer was given by one of our group through an interpreter.

While the construction team was out building

houses, the clinic teams were working in various locations. Sometimes the clinics were held at an orphanage, or a town center, or even an elementary



school. One of our group was a paramedic. The rest filled in where needed. Some did triage with the help

of an interpreter, recorded the patients health concerns, took blood pressures, and checked blood sugar levels. Each day, the clinic started with a devo-



tion, hymn, and prayer.

One team member spoke of how moving it was to hear "How Great Thou Art" sung in Creole. The clinic teams ministered to more

than 1,200 people, mostly mothers and children.
