In January, Pastor Cuma and leaders from several church groups got together and discussed the need for the Blaan Old Testament. All these leaders are very enthusiastic about having the Old Testament and some even said, "Can we start now?"

Word has been forwarded on to our SIL colleagues, in particular about training the team in the basics of translation. For now, we wait patiently for things to begin happening. Please pray with us that this great desire among the Blaan to have the Old Testament will not fade as they wait to receive training. These Blaan pastors do have many other things to do. They are busy with preaching, evangelism, and teaching in their own churches.

Otherwise Pastor Cuma stays very busy supervising the new churches, distributing New Testaments and hymnals, and generally staying in touch with church leaders among the Blaans and other neighboring language groups. We pray for his safety as he travels around the hills on his motorcycle.

work at the JAARS Center. In the picture here, he is mounting a test beam antenna to be used to show the ability of our team to do emergency communication in a field situation. We do this with portable power only. This will be from a gasoline generator and also from solar panels. Each system will be completely selfcontained. The kinds of radio

transmissions will be in the HF, VHF and UHF frequency range and with both voice and digital modulation. We will also be using low power computers with the solar system.

We keep tabs on the kids and grandkids from across the country and across the Atlantic Ocean. All are well

and busy with their lives. Grandson #1, Dominic, is in his last year of high school in South Africa. It is hard to believe this as he was a little boy of two when we married, and now he is a fine young man with college decisions to make. Pray for Dominic as this will be a tough year. His school
