We feel a growing excitement about our next four-year assignment. Not many weeks remain until we pack up and move to Waxhaw, North Carolina. This is where the Wycliffe JAARS Center is located—about a 25 mile drive south of Charlotte, NC.



Lord willing, the first week of April will see us driving south from Connecticut in our minivan. To make the move, we'll also rent a small trailer.

Our initial destination is our house situated about a mile from the JAARS Center. All on one level, the three-bedroom house is surrounded in trees.



It is an immense blessing that this house has belonged to us since we were married in 1997. For the past 10 years it has been rented and well cared for by various Christian families. We never furnished the house so initially we'll focus on that task. Besides finding furniture, we need to set up phone and internet, etc. Sally is looking forward to making this house our home and a place of welcome for many years to come.

Now a little about our assignments. JAARS is Wycliffe's technical center for aviation, computers, communication, transportation, purchasing and shipping. Leon will be talking with his supervisor at JAARS to see where they need him most. This could be in the IT department doing something in the computer area. Since Leon also has a background in communication, they may ask him to work there. We are open to the Lord's best. We do ask everyone to make this a matter of prayer.

Sally is already putting out resumes to area Christian schools. She is hoping to continue teaching—the work that gives her so much joy. Her income will help toward the higher cost of living in the US and enable us to help Pastor Cuma more. Please pray that a position will open up for her in the coming school year.

Before we depart New England for North Carolina, we have two opportunities to share our work and hope to have more time with our family here.

We arrived on the evening of December 11th. Our family was there waiting for us. Of course the kids are taller than we remembered.


The next morning we all piled into the car and headed south to Cape Town and the Cape of Good Hope, at the southern tip of Africa.

This elephant did not look happy with us being so close! We slowly retreated and went on our way.




We enjoyed picnics and played Pit and Uno together in the evenings. We stayed in a fenced-in campground, safe from hungry beasts.
