Our goal there was to meet with and encourage the team of ten men and one woman who have committed themselves to translating the Old Testament and revising the New Testament for the Koronadal Blaan.



When the New Testament was being translated we expats made the decisions on words to use, books to translate, and we paid our translation assistants. Now we are turning this over to the Blaans, making it truly their project. In many ways it is hard to do this, but we believe the day has come for them to take ownership. The really big hurdle for them is finances. How will they pay for rent on a translation office? How will they receive any remuneration for their work? How will they pay for their computers and internet connection? They and we are waiting to see how the Lord is going to meet this huge need. That He will, we have no doubt.

In Joshua chapter 5 the children of Israel left Egypt uncircumcised and dependent on the Lord to protect and provide for them. As they crossed the Jordan River to claim the land God had promised them, they stopped and Joshua circumcised the men as a mark of the Lord on them. For a few days they were in a vulnerable position, as they healed and waited for the Lord's direction in conquering the land. They celebrated the Passover there, and the
