

## Lincoln County ARES / RACES Communications Plan Updated Oct 07

Emergency Alert ONLY: 146.980 Will use Encode of 107.3 CTCSS Tone for Emergency Alerting ONLY (note if your radio supports CTCSS Decode, set it to 107.3 to ONLY hear Emergency Alerts) Note actual normal and Emergency operation on this repeater will use only 100.0 Hz tone

The Emergency Alert tone will be used every hour of any Emergency Event to **Alert** any mobile ham station only monitoring the Emergency Alert Tone and out of Range that drives into range.

The Emergency Alert tone will be tested each week to announce the weekly Lincoln County ARES / RACES Radio net on the 146.980 Repeater each Sunday night.

Lincoln County VHF / UHF Frequencies used for ARES and RACES:

Primary VHF Repeater: 146.980 Tone 100.0 Repeater Primary ARES / RACES

Emergency Alerting 146.980 Tone 107.3 Emergency Alerting ONLY

Simplex VHF FM:

Primary: 146.980 Tone 100.0 Emergency Simplex if repeater fails.

If an event is using another VHF Repeater as its Primary Network and the repeater fails, move to that repeaters output for Emergency Simplex operation.

Repeater Fail – If repeater returns to service, all users will know it is back on the air.

High Frequency:	3939.0 KHz Primary NM State ARES / RACES 60 Meters Chan 3 Primary (5366.5 KHz) If channel 3 is busy, then go to channel 1 and work up until a clear channel is found. 7236.5 KHz Secondary NM State ARES / RACES
Lincoln County	Use the above unless we need to operate on a separate HF network, then go anywhere from 3 to 12 KHz DOWN.
