RUN FOR THE DIAMONDS COORDINATION

This info comes from our Radio Officer for Columbia County, Randy, N3JPV.

Once again its time to collect volunteers for the annual Run for the Diamonds race on Thanksgiving Day in Berwick.

CMARC has been a proud supplier of radio operators for about 30 years.

We station 1 or 2 hams at each milepost to act as the eyes of the Race organizers. We watch for any runners in trouble and report back to Net Control if an ambulance is needed. In all those years we only needed help once as I recall. We got him help within a few minutes.

A secondary reason we do this is to report the ID numbers of the runners who are leading the pack. We will report the first 7 male runners and then the first 3 female runners. The race announcers will relay this info out to the general public over their PA system.

We have fun with this every year and the Race committee is very happy to have our participation. They plug our club often in their announcements.

So here we go! We have 7 mileposts and each one should have 1 or 2 hams to relay the info back to Net Control.

The gun goes off at 10:30 sharp and we need to be in place by 10 AM at the latest.

The race committee will send a timer to each mile post to yell out the time as the runner go by. Sometimes a timer person is not available. If you have a stop watch and an extra person, please bring both along.

The participants will receive a form so they can gather the info as Net Control needs it. Please stop by the Net Control trailer, at 3rd and Market Streets, for that form and other goodies.

Many thanks to Bill, K3WJH, for providing the Net Control trailer!

If you're having guests for Thanksgiving dinner, bring them along to see what we do for our community. The race will finish at about Noon. Plenty of time to get back to Family!

Let me know if you can help us this year. Time is running short so check with your family and let me know as soon as possible.

VE TESTING UPDATE

Our VE team is now a "Field Stocked Team". This is a higher level of VE team since we will now automatically receive all testing materials and updates without making a request. This status was achieved due to our monthly testing schedule and hamfest activities. We are currently the only ARRL VE testing team in our immediate area and have tested Hams from as far away as Lock Haven. Thanks to a dedicated group of volunteers, we have maintained a monthly testing schedule and give tests almost every month before our club meetings.

NET CONTROL STATIONS NEEDED

In order to be prepared to carry on emergency communications when needed, we have an ARES Net on our CMARC repeater, 147.225 +, tone 203.5. The net is activated every Tuesday evening at 7:00 p.m. local time. We need amateurs who will act as net control stations, and you do not need to be a member of CMARC to be a net control station. So if you want to have some fun and be a net control station, send an E-mail to Jack, N3EUM: ilmccorm@ilink.net

Jack is an Assistant ARES Emergency Coordinator, and he is our Net Coordinator who schedules the net control stations. He will provide a script for you to read when you act as net control. Please keep on checking into the net, and encourage others to check in, too!

Jack has about ten people who act as net control stations, so the job of actually being a net control only comes around every ten weeks or so. The more people we have, the less frequently each person has to be net control, and the more people we can involve in emergency communications.

IMPORTANT NOTE: We would like to get more check-ins to the net, so I've started sending out reminders for the net. Please! Use reminders to yourself like sticky-notes to check into the net. The reminders do work!

ARRL DX QSL SERVICE

If you are a member of both CMARC and ARRL, we will forward your DX QSL cards to the ARRL Outgoing QSL Bureau. Just make sure I get the cards (you can give them to me at a meeting or drop your cards at my home), and as soon as I accumulate a pound of cards (about 155 cards), I will forward the cards to the bureau. There is no charge to you for this service, but I must have your ARRL membership number in order to forward your cards.

CMARC collects and sends to the bureau about eight shipments of one pound each of DX QSL cards per year. About ten club members use this service at present. The ARRL has increased the rate from \$8 per pound of QSLs to \$10 per pound. Aren't you glad we offer this service?
