Juneau Amateur Radio Club Information

<u>Repeaters</u>

A Repeater User Guide is provided to all JARC members. The Guide includes instructions for use of features such as: autopatch, autodial, reverse patch, time, and signal strength report. The following repeater information will aid new members and old timers who just can't remember all that stuff!

The JARC repeater frequencies are:

Lena Point 147.00 MHz (-600 KHz offset). To use autopatch: * plus number. # to hang up.

Mt. Roberts 146.82 MHz (-600 KHz offset) linked to Lena Point. Same key sequence as Lena Point for autopatch.

The ARES repeater on the Mendenhall Peninsula operates on 147.30 MHz (+600 KHZ offset). It does not have a phone patch.

Additional repeaters necessary to provide expanded dependable coverage are being considered. A linked system with Whitehorse, YT is in the initial stage of construction.

The repeater trustee is Tim Moore, KL7PF. Control operators are: KB7UBH and WA6AXO. If you are having a problem accessing a repeater function, ask for assistance. There is usually someone monitoring the repeater frequencies who will give assistance.

License Exam Training Materials

JARC has license study materials for: Technician and General classes including texts, videos, computer programs (question pool review and testing), and a computer based Morse code training program (IBM compatible software only). Congratulations to Red Tomlinson WL7UX for passing his requirements for his General Class license, and to Nathaniel Abbott KL0WD and Tom Rozek KL0WE for achieving their Tech Class licenses. We welcome these new hams into the hobby and look forward to hearing them on the air. Thanks to VEs Jerry Prindle KL7HFI, Tad Fujioka NL7KL and Frank Hall AL7HF for hosting the exam.

License Exams after 15 April 2000: Technician Exams will have 35 Questions. The new Technician Class Question Pool is a blend of the prior novice and technician pools. Numbering of the questions has changed and the wording of a few questions has been modified to eliminate references to novice licensees. Our ARRL video courses will still work OK but the numbering of questions in the text "Now You're Talking" will not be consistent with the new question pool. JARC has on hand one full carton of 20 books. There are 394 questions in the Technician Question Pool.

The General Class Exam increases to 35 questions from the previous 30. The new question pool has several new questions pertaining to rules, privileges, third party traffic, and operating procedures. Most of the questions pertaining to more technical aspects such as antennas, electrical principles, circuits, and safety are almost identical in numbering and content to the previous General Class pool. A few questions were drawn from the prior novice and technician pools but none were drawn from the advance class pool. The existing training video and computer disks will continue to provide good training tools for learning answers to technical questions as long as the trainees use other resources to study the new questions on rules. The new General Class Question Pool has 385 questions.

Extra Class Exams are increasing to 50 questions from the previous 40 and the Question Pool is an amalgamation of the former Extra and Advance Class pools. The new Extra Class Question Pool has 698 questions. JARC does not now stock any extra class training supplies.

The Redmond group contains a lot of techie types, so I seem to fit in pretty well! They're gearing up for the upcoming Ten Meter Contest in early December. It's a friendly group of about 20 hams who meet monthly at a local restaurant for breakfast. There's no business meeting, and any written communication takes place via e-mail. Another nice aspect of this group is that its membership consists of all ages of hams, not just old guys like me! There are some active QRP CW operators and builders among the younger folks.

PSK31 is a new keyboard mode that attracts interest and discussion among this group. I've been on PSK for awhile now, and it's really quite astounding how well it works--noticeable more effective than RTTY or packet when used on HF. I like PSK because you don't need to spend any money on a modem. All that's needed is a relatively modern radio and a personal computer, and some free software which can be downloaded from the internet. Also needed are appropriate audio cables to connect audio from the transceiver to the computer sound card. All the modem functions and signal processing take place in the computer's sound card and are software driven. PSK works so well because of its extremely narrow bandwidth--only 31 Hertz for a keying rate of about 50 words per minute. It's truly a high tech mode and can probably outperform a human copying CW. I'm impressed by the new mode because it finally utilizes some of the power of our personal computers, instead of just using the PC as a dumb terminal like most other digital modes.

The Western Washington DX Club is a much larger club than I'm accustomed to. They hold dinner meetings monthly at various locations around the Seattle metropolitan area. I like the club bulletins--they're very well written and always interesting. The meetings are fun too, and usually consist of a slide show or video of various DX activities and locations. I particularly enjoyed slides which showed Ascension Island, ZD8, a

small rock in the middle of the Atlantic. The autumn picnic was held at a member's home in Edmonds. What a QTH! he's about 75 feet up a shallow bluff overlooking the waterfront with a clear shot in nearly all directions. Then there's the Mike & Key club, which meets in Renton. I don't know much about them, but Bob Simpson, NL7XZ has been to some of their meetings, so ask him! They do a lot of public service work and are involved with the Red Cross.

Other interesting activities: We still take an occasional motor home trip and have both HF and two meter radios on board. HF mobiling is great fun, and would be even more enjoyable if I could get rid of the confounded noise, which might be coming from the vehicle computer. Some of our best HF mobile activities were with WA6AXO when we were caravaning across the desert in Southern California last winter. Frederick actually loaded up a vertical wire which was suspended between two kites! He then proceeded to make contacts on 160 meters. VHF repeater activity here seems down from years past, perhaps because almost everyone carries a cellular telephone.
