



145.19 Repeater update 5/2k

The repeater has been plagued with an unidentified signal causing it to remain keyed and emit a raucous sounding buzz that we call "spooge". This problem at first was believed to be the rusty chain link fence surrounding the transmitter site, radiating in response to the high RF field from the television station. It appears that this is not the case, as the problem has not gone away with the advent of warm weather and rain.

AARA has decided that the best way to combat the problem at this time is to introduce a PL (Private Line) access system on the machine. This work has been completed and the repeater now requires a 107.2 Hz PL tone to activate the transmitter. This means that users will need to configure their radio to transmit this tone.

We still regard this machine as an "open repeater" and do not want to discourage anyone from using it. Regular automated announcements are carried on the machine reminding users of this tone requirement. We hope this will not impede anyone from making use of the machine and are looking into ways to temporarily disable the PL requirement for users without tone capability.

Please continue to utilize the machine and we will inform you of any future changes. If you have any questions or special needs regarding the repeater please let one of the board members know.
