Amateur Radio Ranks Slowing

According to Amateur Radio census statistics cited in the October 15, 1999, W5YI Report, US licensee growth has nearly stalled overall during the past year. The W5YI numbers--which exclude hams whose licenses have expired but remain within the two-year grace period--show 675,739 US licensees as of September 30, 1999. While that's up by more than 3000 hams over the same month in 1998, the number represents less than onehalf percent growth.

The number of US amateurs peaked over the past year at 676,318 at the end of July. Looking at the numbers by license class, only Technician showed substantial growth-up by more than 10,500 from a year earlier. Tech Plus and Amateur Extra classes rose slightly too, but the numbers were down slightly for Advanced and General, and the number of Novice licensees declined by more than 5100 over the past year. From "The ARRL Letter" October 29: During the Southwestern Division Convention October 1-3, FCC Legal Adviser for Enforcement Riley Hollingsworth reiterated a pledge to undertake two amateur enforcement initiatives in the coming months: encroachment of unlicensed activity on 10 meters and improper or illegal marketing of HF amplifiers -- especially those capable of 11-meter operation. He said that problems on VHF no longer would take a back seat to HF enforcement. He also advised attendees to adhere to the basis and purpose stated in Section 97.1 of the FCC rules. In response to a question during a convention forum, Hollingsworth clarified that jamming a station thought to be breaking the FCC rules on a repeater is never justifiable and always illegal. "We have never suggested -- let alone authorized -- jamming as a way to keep certain people off," he said.

ST PETER & ST PAUL DXPEDITION DELAYED

The Brazilian Navy, through the Secretariat of the Commission of Ocean Resources has announced another postponement of the journey in which a ship will transport a DXpedition to the Archipelago of St Peter & St Paul, 1.1 kM from Natal, Brazil (PS7). Note that this is NOT a cancellation. According to a press release from the Natal DX Group, the main reason given for the postponement was flooding caused by very high tide in early morning hours of October 25. The force of the waters was said to have caused extensive damage. On Thursday, officers of the Brazilian Navy and technicians from Natal departed to inspect the damage in the Archipelago. Their report will not be available until their return late this coming week.

The group will be releasing information in various DX bulletins and provide a new schedule for the DXpedition. The members of the DXpedition, who have incurred the monetary expenses necessary to realize the DXpedition, regret the delay. It is believed that operations will not begin before November 7.

The operators -- Karl, PS7KM/ZX0SK and Tino PT7AA/ZW0SP -- expressed their regret at the unfortunate turn to events and noted that the decision to delay the DXpedition was out of their control.
