Field day

has been conducted from the Village's parks where the principal objective was to help ensure that ham radio volunteers are ready to assist their communities in the event of a natural or man-made disaster. This year the objective includes testing the new EOC's systems and facilities. For example, the plan is to power all three stations off the EOC's very large battery bank for the entire Field Day period.

Ken Roundtree, Wellington's Emergency Management Director and WRC member said "Field Day is designed to test ham radio operators' abilities to fulfill the EOC's mission as well as to set up and operate stations in the field under emergency conditions, such as the loss of commercial power."

In the Western Communities, only Wellington's EOC is reported to be activated for this exercise. The public is invited to observe and learn how to participate as volunteers to help secure their communities.

WRC's Vice President Juan Abellon, MD KG4QYY is particularly pleased that this year's Field Day is at the EOC. Last September he made a presentation to the officials of the Western Communities' coordinating group about the role of the Citizens Corps.

One of its goals is to bring volunteers and first responders, including emergency managers, closer. Of note is that Juan has been joined by others from the amateur

By chance I was mobile a couple of Saturdays ago when our link opened and I made contact with Larry KS4NB in Wellington Florida. Larry and I have been having QSO'S for some time and I send him copies of the newsletter to have at the club.

Larry informed me that the club was dedicating the new emergency comms rooms on the following Monday night their time. They would have the Mayor of their city and other dignatorys in attendance. Was there any posibility of having our mayor present for a link-up on IRLP?

A quick call to Neil (ZL2TNG, Club President) and low and behold the whole thing took shape. Timing meant that the sked would take place at approx 12 noon (New Zealand Time, NZT) on Tuesday.

Neil ZL2TNG adds the following:

1) Saturday got e-mail.

2) Sunday rang Mayor,

3) Monday emails back and forth. Larry and Neil time set for 1215hrs NZT.

4) 1100 NZT Larry asked if we could bring time forward 30 minutes... panic. Contacted Etchells, Mayor and others.... phew OK.

5) 1145hrs, Mayor Wayne, CD Etchells. WRC Manager Emergency Management Rian van Schalkwyk, Peter Norden Pres NZART, Gav Smith NZART AREC Liason, Leader newspaper reporter uncle Tom Cobly and all arrive.

6) Contact happens about 1210hrs.

At the alloted time we had Peter Nordon ZL2SJ President NZART as controller. The Mayor of Upper Hutt City Wayne Guppy, Gavin ZL2ACT AREC deputy for branch 63, David Etchels ZL2ULK in his capacity as Emergency Management Officer and Rural Fire Officer Upper Hutt along with several others at the clubrooms and Debby ZL2TDM NZART Business Manager at NZART HQ also with several others in attendance.

Larry opened the sked and welcomed us to the Wellington Radio Club situated in Florida. Wellington is a village of some 45,000 inhabitants located 60kms N/E of Miami. Larry then brought Mayor Tom to the mike and a warm welcome to the airwaves was made to Mayor Wayne. Wayne really stirred it up when mentioning that he had attended University in a neighbouring state (Nebraska) and was a fan of the Corn Huskers a state football team. The airwaves certainly came alive with some good banter between the two of them.

Time constraints relative to other displays and formalities meant that we could not continue for as long as we would have liked but we certainly made big inroads. Invitations to visit were expressed from all sides and e-mail addresses were exchanged. It was proposed that we may be asked to assist to set up another sked involving a meeting of both full councils to be had on air and in our case the possibility of having the Mayor of Wellington Kerry Prendagast present.
