OLD PHENOMENA? CELLPHONE SIMPLIFIES COAX TESTING... REPLACES COSTLY ANTENNA ANALYZERS

True stories abound about silver amalgum dental fillings permiting people to directly "hear" radio broadcasts. Recently, another phenomena

that causes teeth to act as RF detectors was accidentally discovered.

A newly introduced "Toothbrush Phone" has soft but conductive, spaceage carbon bristles that are part of its antenna. While bushing, teeth become RF sensitized and effectively increase the antenna's capture area!

As often happens, hams come up with new applications for technical advances... including this one. The procedure for coax testing is simple as Larry KS4NB demonstrates. After sensitizing your teeth, you sandwich the

coax between his teeth. Then feed an RF carrier, modulated with a 1000 Hertz tone, into the transmission line. The tone's loudness is directly proportional to standing waves. When no tone heard there's a perfect match. A loud tone means high SWR... a sure sign of bad coax, connectors or antenna.

IMPROVED PREPAREDNESS & EMERGENCY OPERATIONS MODERN TOWER SHELTER TO HOUSE WRC REPEATERS

Sunday - May 15th - 8 am to Noon Help Move Our Repeaters! Call Larry KS4NB, 385-2986 to assist.

Many WRC members have visited the Village tower site to learn about our repeater systems and what a tower site is like. In our case, the current equipment shelter leaves a lot to be desired. The cramped, 27 year-old fiberglass structure has rotting wood floors and smoke stained walls after numerous lightning strikes.

Its electrical and ground systems have been upgraded a number of times... but still are not what they should be. That's all about to change.

By May 16th, an up-to-date concrete shelter will house both Village and WRC communications systems.

Left: The modern concrete shelter, right, is now being prepared for the Village by contractors. The old structure will be replaced by another identical prefab unit to be occupied by NEXTEL. The grounding system is extensive. A ground "ring" is buried around the building and connected to the tower's main ground field. All metallic surfaces on the structure, the foundation's rebar and cable trays are connected to the ring's ground rods. All dozen or so coax hardlines have surge protectors mounted on copper ground bars. Outside lighting with remote sensors will cover the entire area.



Right: The interior is about 50% larger than the old shelter. WRC radio equipment and a large backup battery bank will be located along the ten foot west wall. All WRC equipment will be connected to the common copper ground plate on the left. Both 120 and 240VAC outlets will be available with separate circuit breakers for each repeater. Two air conditioners are in place to ensure continuous environmental control. The entire building is alarm wired for temperature, power and security. Plentiful cable trays are overhead to facilitate wiring.

New EOC Communications Room Planned EOC Annex Dedicated

From the photo below you can see how congested the Wellington EOC was during the last Hurricane Season. To improve emergency operations, the EOC Annex in Village Park (see map pg. 5) has been setup to house Public Works field personnel and other Village personnel.

Also in progress is the relocation of the Communications Section from the "bull pen." Because of the congestion, the number of volunteer communicators was severely restricted and the room was often very noisy. Those conditions have been corrected with the relocation of the communications section to its own spacious, quiet room (behind the door on left in photo below).


GREAT WEATHER & PUBLIC EXPOSURE AND BEST OF ALL... NO LOST CHILDREN!

WHERE ARE WE IN THE SOLAR CYCLE? THOUGHTS ON PROPAGATION FROM PHIL HK3SA EARTH ON A HOT SUMMERS NIGHT

WWV on 15:00 MHz at 18 minutes after the hour reports ionospheric condition and the solar flux index each day.

This past week the solar flux has been less than 80 which, to say the least, has been poor.

It is speculated the present solar cycle has yet to begin its recovery which unfortunately mean we still have many years before propagation will allow us to have meaningful QSO's on 10 meters late into the evening as was possible 10 years ago. (See the NOAA graph below).



Never the less, looking on the bright side of things, that is to say, the silver lining to the dark cloud; attached is the latest satellite imagery taken at 18:55 UTC from the new satellite "Amazon" showing intense activity of an ongoing solar storm.

Increases in ionization will produce unsettled atmospheric conditions significantly effecting global communications for the maritime mobile and Spiderweb nets within the next few days... "hi".

BELOW: The latest longterm NOAA propagation forecast hasn't changed much. It will be about 2 years until Jan. '07 before Sunspot Numbers, SSNs, start to steadily improve. SSNs vary hourly so you will still have good propagation at times... but smoothed averages are the basis for prediction. Unfortunately, averages as low as 5 are predicted which translates to lower Maximum Useable Frequencies and practically "dead" higher frequency bands during most of the day in 2006/7.



Too CLOSE FOR COMFORT? NEA COMING TO A NEIGHBORHOOD NEAR YOU!

As you read this story, remember the Moon is an average of 240,000 miles away. Now imagine an asteroid just 150,000 miles from Earth! This celestial body is the largest in many months coming this close. (Editor: This is NOT an April Fools article).

Near Earth Asteroid (NEA) "2005 ED318" May 24th


On May 24th 2005 NEA "2005 ED318" will come within 147,204 miles to Earth. (or 245,340 kilometers). This is 0.0164 AU's. AU stands for Astronomical Unit. 1 AU = 149,597,871 kilometers. (or 89,758,722 miles). In astronomical terms this is a close fly by.



Near Earth Object Program

APRIL 24TH: ED318 is about 9 million miles from the Earth and closing fast.





The planets are white lines, and the asteroid/comet is a blue line. The bright white line indicates the portion of the orbit that is above the ecliptic plane, and the darker portion is below the ecliptic plane. Likewise for the asteroid orbit, the light blue indicates the portion above the ecliptic plane, and the dark blue the portion below it.
