- 1. Call to order By Lou KG8NK
- 2. Officer roll call, all officers are present
- 3. Called members roll call
- 4. President Lou called for approval of the meeting agenda.
 - a. Rich N8GBA made a motion to accept second by Steve KD8CCP
- 5. <u>Secretary's report</u> was provided by Fred KD8JIP Jim W8QQE was absent at the last meeting Jack N8JRN made a motion to accept, second by Rick N8GBA. The motion passed.
- 6. <u>Treasures report</u> by Fred KD8JIP. Swap and shop generated income for the club several bills were paid, detail was provided in the report to the club. The report was approved as is.
- 7. <u>Outside correspondence and mail.</u> None was received.
- <u>Committee Reports</u>. Repeater and controller are at Anderson Communications being repaired.
 Some problems have been noted with the 147.27 machine. A new antenna is available, just waiting to get it installed. Installation should take place as soon as weather and climbers are available.

Nothing new in ARES RACES

April 10th is a tentative date for the spring time set, Lou will be sending information later. A goal is to send simplex messages all over the U.P. and all the way to Lansing. Some discussions about how we may be able to do this, may be difficult to do at all.

Rich N8GBA mentioned that the new owner of radio stations in Newberry, Munising, and Ishpeming, is interested in doing interviews of the local Ham clubs and their activities. They would also help with fund raisers. There is also the possibility of using their towers for ARES, RACES.

- 9. <u>Old Business</u> Lou reported that the dog sled race was a success, all stations were covered and no major problems were encountered. Some log problems were noted, but they were just a matter of catching up, the Wetmore site had a few problems getting timely reports, but all were as current as they could be and under control. The problems were unfounded. GPS may be used next year to identify locations of stations. The race may be expanded to 300 miles next year so that it can be used as a qualifier for the Iditarod.
