Marquette: 8:30am eastern time, (arrive by 8:00am) Marquette County Health Dept. Bldg., U.S. 41 just east of the Michigan State Police Post. You MUST preregister at least by the Tuesday evening preceding the Saturday test date. Contact Rich N8GBA at 249-3837, n8gba@att.net or Greg KI8AF at ki8af@arrl.net.

Please arrive one-half hour early for test sessions to give time to process applications. Testing applicants should bring the following items with them: Two pieces of I.D. one being a photo I.D., Original license and one clear copy of their license if applicable, Completed form 605 (one will be provided if you don't have one), pencils, calculator and the test fee of \$15.00. Please have the correct fee as examiners do not carry change. You must have an FRN and **provide a valid email address**. Please contact the individual(s) *listed to confirm date(s), location(s), etc.*

Note: Other clubs in the area may offer license testing. For a listing you can go to the ARRL website at arrl.org. Click on Licensing, Education, Training, then Getting Licensed, and then Find An Exam Session. You can search by zip code or other criteria.

June 18, 2023

WHEREAS, amateur radio operators are celebrating over a century of broadcasting; and,

WHEREAS, amateur radio has continued to build bridges between people, societies, and countries through the sharing of ideas and the fostering of friendship; and,

WHEREAS, amateur radio operators have provided countless hours of community service to other local organizations throughout these decades; and,

WHEREAS, the state also recognizes the services amateur radio provides to our many emergency response organizations, including local and government-served agencies; and,

WHEREAS, these amateur radio services are provided as a free service to the public; and,

WHEREAS, these same individuals have further demonstrated their commitment to public service by providing free radio communications for local parades, bike-a-thons, walk-a-thons, fairs, and other charitable events; and,

WHEREAS, the American Radio Relay League is the leading organization for Amateur Radio in the USA; and,

WHEREAS, the ARRL Amateur Radio Field Day exercise will take place on June 24 - 25, 2023, and is a 24-hour emergency preparedness exercise and demonstration of the Radio Amateurs' skills and readiness to provide self-supporting communication without further infrastructure being required;

You might recall that last year KPH broadcast in Morse Code and Teletype format a message encrypted using the notorious World War II German encryption device known as the ENIGMA machine. The response to that broadcast was so overwhelmingly positive that we are planning on doing this again. Now, here comes the MRHS Cryptography Department Manager, Kevin McGrath/KM with details!



ATTENTION ALL INTERCEPT OPERATORS!

Crypto Transmission from KPH

The MRHS in cooperation with our good friends at the <u>Cipher History Museum</u> will send a coded message in 5-letter groups via the facilities of coast station KPH on Saturday July 22, 2023. The message will be encrypted using the famous Enigma code machine.

The Enigma was the Germans' most sophisticated coding machine for securely transmitting command and control messages via radio communications in WWII. It was considered so secure that it was used to encipher the most top-secret of messages.

All KPH listeners are invited to try their hand at receiving and decrypting the message. Certificates will be awarded for proof of successful decode, first to decode, and use of original or replica hardware.

You say your Enigma code machine has gotten a bit rusty? No problem, MRHS has you covered! Software simulations exist for the Enigma code machine. Click Here for an easy-to-use Enigma simulator. It is webbased, so no download is necessary.

Crypto broadcast date, time and formats

The crypto broadcast will commence at 2000Z (1300 Pacific) on 22 July 2023 on all KPH CW and RTTY frequencies (in kc): 426 (IF in service, after an announcement on 500), 6477.5, 8642.0, 12808.5, 17016.8, 22477.5 . Upon completion of the CW transmissions, the broadcast will be repeated on all KPH RTTY frequencies. The RTTY transmission will be 170cps shift Baudot, 45 baud. The frequencies are (in kc): 6324.5, 8427.0 and 12585.5
