From Section Emergency Coordinator, Max KE8DON:

We also will be releasing the first 2 new EmComm courses April 1. Basic EmComm and Intermediate EmComm will be live in the ARRL Learning Center April 1. With the new courses being released the legacy courses will be removed April 1. Anyone who is currently enrolled in EC-001 or EC-016 will need to complete these courses by April 1 to receive credit for them. We hope to have Advanced EmComm and ARES Leadership courses complete by early summer.

And finally, we have a new project to assist local ARES groups in recruiting for their local ARES team. We are going to be launching Advertising in ARRL publications and other national publications to recruit new members to ARES. This campaign will lead them to a webpage where they can enter their location and it will provide the contact information for a local ARES team.
