Howard Schweppe K8OV SK

MARQUETTE - Lt. Col. (Ret) Howard B. Schweppe Jr., 66, of 47 Elder Drive, Marquette, passed away Tuesday evening, April 27, 2010, after a six year battle with leukemia.

Born Nov. 24, 1943, in Fort Myers, Fla., a son of Howard B. and Else H. (Theurer) Schweppe Sr., he was raised in the Detroit area. A 1961 graduate of Bentley High School in Livonia, Howard continued his education at Eastern Michigan University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree and later a master's degree in Public Administration from Central Michigan University. Following his ROTC commission, Howard began a career in the U.S. Army that spanned over 22 years. During his illustrious military career, Howard served in the following capacities: Special Forces team leader, operations officer and advisor, counterintelligence unit commander, instructional supervisor, intelligence staff officer, and intelligence unit commander. He served as assistant professor of military science, the largest ROTC program in the State of Michigan, at Michigan State University, and later was promoted to chief of the counterintelligence support branch in Washington, D.C. In 1984, Howard moved to Marquette where he served as ROTC department head and professor of military science at Northern Michigan University. Additionally, Howard received numerous awards and citations for his work in the classroom as a lecturer, leadership in the field, and his ability to inspire and command. A veteran of Vietnam, he received the Bronze Star and Vietnam Cross of Gallantry for meritorious war service. Decorated by his own country and honored by several other nations, Howard concluded his military career, with a reputation for excellence, in 1988 when he retired. However, a leader and teacher never quite retire, and so he often returned to the classroom to recount his vast experiences. Following retirement, Howard devoted his time to Marq-Tran, leading the transit authority for 16 1/2 years, first as assistant director and then as Human Resources Officer. His other affiliations included the Hiawatha Amateur Radio Association of Marguette County, an active member of the Rotary Club, and his involvement on many local civic committees.

Howard loved the Upper Peninsula, including outdoor activities and all that nature had to offer. He especially enjoyed canoeing, biking, and activities with his son.

Survivors include his wife, Julie; son, Eric Edwin Schweppe of Marquette; two sisters, Karen L. (Warren) Bright of Livonia and Anne M. (David) Kissinger of Orlando, Fla.; and many nieces and nephews.
