FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

What is Wilderness Protocol? In the April issue of CQ's Amateur Radio there was a commentary on the use of the Wilderness Protocol and back-country EMCOMM procedures. Many amateur radio operators have never heard of or utilized this emergency procedure. As stated in the article the purpose of Wilderness Protocol is to help radio operators to obtain help for themselves or others in distress when outside of other means of communications. With many of us involved with outdoor activities and utilizing hand held radios, some areas cannot reach various repeaters.

At this time Wilderness Protocol recommends five simplex FM amateur frequencies: 146.520, 52.525, 223.5, 446.0, and 1294.5 MHz. These frequencies should be monitored every three hours at the top of the hour from 7 a.m. To 7 p.m. This would be the time zone in your current area. When traveling I can't remember even monitoring simplex! Also consider joining HARA's emergency net at 7:00 p.m. Sunday nights on 147.270. This is a great time to practice using your radio, especially new amateur radio operators.

Note: HARA monthly meeting start time changed to 7:00pm for the May meeting because of Storm Spotter Training. See you there.
