On The Bands......W1AW/*

If you are doing any listening on the HF bands you can't help but hear all the W1AW/* portable stations on the air. This would be a good time for you to Work All States (WAS) if you've never tried or had the opportunity. Try to do it on just one band or all bands it doesn't matter, just get on the air. Each state will be on the air twice with the second go around for each to start midyear so don't delay.



What does this do? DSP

Digital Signal Processing is a filtering process which frees you from installing many analog filters for each operating mode. Additionally, you can control the bandwidth, cancel the multiple jamming beat, and reduce the noise level using DSP filtering technology. There are many variable available here and differ for manufacturers and rig to rig so, you have to check out your owner/operating manual to get the most out of DSP.

Impedance-matching device: A device that matches one impedance level to another. For example, it may match the impedance of an antenna system to the impedance of a transmitter or receiver. Amateurs also call such devices a Transmatch, impedance-matching network or antenna tuner.

Officers present: President Fred Mouser KD8JIP, Vice-President Bruce Carlson N9MDE, and Treasurer Lucille Scotti KD8PTE.

Meeting was called to order by Fred KD8JIP at 7:30pm. There were 15 members and 4 guests.

Secretary's report: The March minutes were published in the *Standing Wave*. Motioned to accept the minutes as published by Ralph N8HXG, and seconded by Karl AC8MB. Motioned passed.

Treasurer's report: Lucille KD8PTE gave our financial report for March. Motion to accept made by Lou KG8NK and seconded by Bill KC8EWD. Motion passed.

Correspondence: Flyer received about Swap meet in Cadillac, Mi. on May 3rd. Also a notice was received from NMB that their Chocolay branch is closing.

Repeater/Tech: Paul KB0P reported that currently all repeaters are up and running.

ARES/RACES: Lou KG8NK reported that the Marquette EC position I still open and needs to be filled. He also mentioned that he's tried to step down twice from the DEC position. He'd be willing to stay on if his request to get the U.P. split up into at least two sections which would ease travel and training for all concerned. Dickenson County has a new EC.

Old business: Old business items were rolled into new business.

New business:

- -A Field Day site has not been found yet and several of our members will check out some different locations for possible Field Day activities. The biggest hurdles for a couple of the sites are the cost involved or already reserved for another even.
- -If you would like Lane WD8PAJ to purchase an advance entry ticket for the Dayton Hamvention you need to get in touch with him by 4/4/2014. Fred KD8JIP brought up the idea of maybe buying a few cheaper items at Dayton and trying to resell them at our Swap'n'Shop on our club tables. After further discussion them idea was put on the back burner.
- -Fred KD8JIP, Bruce KH6IK, and Lane WD8PAJ met with Eric N8RRZ from NMU in regards to airing some PSA spots. Lane will be doing a TV spot on NMU TV as well as a spot or two on NMU's public radio. The group will also be checking with local commercial radio stations to possibly air some amateur radio PSA spots. NMU has a calendar of events which can list HARA activities such as our monthly meetings and VE test sessions.
- -Bill KC8EWD reported that in earlier discussion about possible obtaining old NMS repeaters are actually transmitters and weigh about 700 lbs. Bill was informed that we couldn't use them and pass on our thanks to the crew at the NWS for thinking of us.
- -Our visitors from the Delta County Amateur Radio Society (DCARS) passed around some photos or their RACES/ARES emergency communications trailer.

Congratulations to Lucille KD8PTE for winning the 50/50 drawing. Motion to adjourn at 8:08pm by Bill KC8EWD and seconded by Lou KG8NK. Motion approved.
