Past September meeting

At last month's meeting we discussed the G5RV antenna developed by Louis Varney, G5RV – Silent Key. We discussed various aspects of the G5RV and why Mr. Varney developed it.

We also discussed methods of feeding it including the use of a coax choke or a 1:1 current balun. It's interesting to note that there is a low-angle vertical component radiated off of the 450 ohm ladder line because of the mismatch between the ladder line and the coax feeding it. A coax choke is then used to keep rf from being radiated off of the coaxial cable (feed line).

If a 1:1 balun were used to link the coax to the ladder line, it would be very effective at reducing common mode currents on the coax. But that would reduce the low angle component.

So we concluded that the use of balun or choke would depend on the operation and working conditions.

After the meeting, I did some research on making a simple choke by wrapping coax around a pvc core. I have done this and it's easy to do and effective. But I found that people have had problems with the bending effect and sun breaking down the cable dielectric etc. In place of this, a ferrite clip on choke can be used. They slide over the coax at the feedpoint. Everyone seemed to enjoy the discussion, I know I did!

Hands on night – October meeting

It was later decided to not build the two G5RV antennas as a group. Rather we could buy a ready made antenna(s) to give out at the Christmas Party. There is very little cost difference, but the version we would have made may be a better quality.

The VP position

At the September meeting I announced that I would be stepping down from the Vice President position effective at the October meeting. I was very honored to be nominated for club positions a year ago and have enjoyed the Vice President duties. I enjoyed being involved in the club presentations/programs and appreciate the support I received. My emphasis is not so much technical, but learning and advancement.
