A Visit to the Ham Radio Outlet Superstore in Milwaukee

Regardless what the sign out front says, this is no longer the AES store that so many of us in this part of the country knew and loved. If you haven't made the pilgrimage to Milwaukee lately, the new Ham Radio Outlet (HRO) store (at 5710 W. Good Hope Rd.) is definitely worth a look.

It appears to me that they actually expanded the display area, although that may be just an optical illusion brought on by the racks and racks —and more racks — of radios, antennas and just about every accessory known to man. And while I truly did think highly of AES, it seems that HRO has taken an entirely different tactic when it comes to their display shelves. Instead of being enclosed in glass display cases, almost every item is accessible to the customer. And that includes at least half a dozen working display stations located against the back wall!



Someone asked me about prices. I am certainly no expert, but the prices seemed reasonable to me. For example, I picked up a Yaesu MH-34B4B speaker/mic for my FT-60R for \$31.95. That was after I tried a cheaper off-brand speaker/mic whose connector kept popping out of the plug and keying the HT. And I did see some sale signs around the store. My advice is if you are seriously interested in an item, call and speak with their friendly sales staff which, by the way, includes at least one of the old AES crew (that I saw during my visit).
