If you haven't heard, we're back in business!! WATS purchased a new Sony video camera and, thanks to the skills of Larry Bush W5NCD (and many others who helped carry out the 12th floor re-installation), we have a new package that can once again view the lovely

The SkyCam I was a pet project of Horace Bushnell W5TAH and W5NCD back in 1998, but it had the bad habit of losing its focus settings anytime there was a power glitch. The SkyCam II remedied that problem and provided a wonderful pan-tilt head and enclosure. It endured "the elements" atop the Waco Hilton for almost 3 years since its debut in September 1998, but finally succumbed to ultraviolet rays and the elements by developing cataracts (a "cloudy lens" for you non-medical types :-). Since the SkyCam was one of the best facets of WATS, the members agreed

to fund the purchase of a new camera from our treasury. W5NCD found a great buy on the Internet for a new Sony Hi8 camcorder—with IR remote. The remote was very important, you see, because we needed a way to control the zoom with our DTMF tones. Rather than attempt to wire into the camera's zoom switch, it was much easier to wire into the remote and let the infrared digital signal from the remote do all the work. We simply had to supply the proper voltage for the remote to function (without batteries). W5NCD took care of wiring up the remote, as well as replacing all the external wiring for the whole assembly and the rest of us had the fun of helping to install it.

The camera has a 20x optical zoom and will digitally magnify up to 200x! But the resulting image is so poor as to be practically useless, so we settled on the 40x max zoom setting (i.e., a magnification of one fourth of the pixels in the 20x optical image). As a matter of note, while testing at 200x, I was able to zoom in on one window! of the Hillcrest Baptist Medical Center—that's almost three miles away! This is the best camera we have ever had on the Skycam!

The remote has been modified to be operated by the Skycam controller, which receives it's signals from a VHF radio. Larry also reports the commercial dish antenna, installed alongside the Skycam without our knowledge, has been lowered, again giving the Skycam an almost unobstructed view.

John Chamberlain reported on recent special events for which our members furnished television coverage. Several members recorded video of the Wild West Century Bike Run. John will use clips from each and make a video and present it to members of the Waco Bicycle Club, sponsor of the event.
