Overview of the Event / How Was DCS Used: Communication support for the race and augmenting the Redondo Beach DSW organization. This event is effectively a disaster communications field training activity. 10 LACo DCS members, 2 RBPD DSW members, 1 PVEPD "NART" DSW member, 3 Torrance "TARA" DSW members and 3 additional operators staffed the event. According to the race director there were near 6300 runners plus a large spectator crowd. Redondo Beach Police Chief, Keith Kauffman personally thanked me and our entire team for the support we give the city during this large event! The Redondo Beach FD also appreciated our participation.

Suggestions / Issues: There were no communications issues using the Palos Verdes Estates DSW Neighborhood Amateur Radio Team's UHF repeater. The repeater had 100% handheld coverage over the entire operational area. The event Race Director and assistant were very satisfied and appreciative of the team's radio communications support, amateur radio support is important for these events. This demonstrates the significant advantages of having a productive relationship with neighboring cities.

Equipment / Modes of Communications Used: 440 MHz FM HT Radios; W6PVE FM Repeater

Other Agencies Involved: RBPD had a complete full showing of all officers including Police Chief, reserves, armored vehicle, K9 Units for bomb detection, SWAT officers, and undercover officers. RBFD had a Battalion Chief, an engine and paramedics including bicycle paramedic units. The LACo Lifeguards were also assisting as an outside agency per RBFD.
