Cary Midsummer Swapfest



SpaceShipOne Ready to Make History

In a press release issued on June 2nd, Scaled Composites Corp announced that they would make the attempt to launch the first privately sponsored commercial manned space vehicle.

With financial backing of Paul Allen of Microsoft, and the engineering prowess of Burt Rutan, Scaled Composites has readied their re-useable sub orbital launch vehicle. The vehicle, named SpaceShipOne, will be capable of sub orbital flight, but is not capable of reaching the speeds required for continuos orbiting of the earth.

Burt Rutan made aviation news in 1986 by developing the Voyager, the only aircraft to fly non-stop around the world without refueling. Scaled Composites currently expects to make their attempt on June 21st. The Discovery Channel will be filming to create a documentary on this historic event, should they succeed.

At a planned maximum altitude of 100 kilometers (about 62 miles), the craft will be well above the atmosphere, and the pilot will experience a view similar to being in orbit. He will be the first pilot to earn astronaut wings in a non-government aircraft, as well as the first private citizen to fly a spaceship out of the atmosphere.

Well, THAT should get the socialists squawking. How dare they cut the government bureaucracy out! No doubt the luddites will attempt to make them cease and desist, citing OSHA or EPA violations....

But are we not living in exciting times, that this amazing engineering achievement could be realized? Is not America at times a wonderful place? I am fortunate to be here to take notice.
