

Ham Call Sign Choice Soon

The FCC has announced its intention to implement a vanity call sign program and also to resume the issuance of club and military recreation station licences. On February 1, 1995, the commission released its Report and Order in PR Docket 93-305, "Amendment of the Amateur Service Rules to Implement a Vanity Call Sign System.

Amateurs will be eligible to apply for a call sign of their choice in four "gates." The first group eligible to apply will be previous owners of a callsign or the close relative of an amateur call sign who is deceased. The second group will be Amateur Extra Class licensees; the third Advanced; the fourth, all others.

The FCC will announce the opening date of each "gate" by public notice.

The effective date of the new rules is March 24, 1995. The FCC said that the first "gate" will open as soon as the new application form, FCC Form 610-V is available, and the commission's licensing facility is prepared to begin processing the applications - no sooner that April, according to the FCC staff.

In the case of call signs for deceased amateurs, normally the call sign will not be available for two years following the person's death, or for two years following the expiration of the license. The exception to this rule is that a relative of the deceased amateur may apply for a call sign without regard for the two year

Club station call signs will be issued systematically from the two-by-three block, unless, under the fourth gate, the trustee of an existing club station applies for the call sign of a deceased member as a vanity call sign for the club. The trustee's application must be accompanied by the written consent of at least on relative of the deceased member, and the two year waiting period mentioned above is waived.

"Close relative" is defined as spouse, child, grandchild, stepchild, parent grandparent, stepparent, brother, sister, stepbrother, stepsister, aunt, uncle,

nephew, niece, or in-law for purposes of determining eligibility for a deceased amateurs call sign.

A close relative can apply for the call of a deceased amateur without regard to license class; that is, a Novice licensee can apply for a call sign otherwise assigned to a higher license class block.

Club Station Trustees, but not "RACES or military recreation station trustees, , will be able to request specific club call signs in the gate determined by their own class of operator license. If the Trustee holds an Amateur Extra Class License, he may apply for the same call, (provided that it has been vacant for two years), in Gate Two, either for the club or for himself, without asking anyone's permission.

Applications for new club and military recreation licence, with sequential call signs will be accepted beginning March 24, 1995. A club must have such a license in order to apply (later) for a vanity club call.

The fee for the use of a vanity call will be \$7 per year, or \$70 for a 10year license term. The FCC said that " because the normal term of an amateur station license is ten years, a fee of \$70 will have to be paid when requesting a new or renewed vanity call sign.

"At this time," the FCC said, "we cannot provide a one-time processing fee for vanity call sign applications."

Amateur will be able to list up to 25 call sign choices, from any call area. The ARRL had said it preferred that the traditional call areas be kept intact, and the FCC said that it "carefully consid-

THE CARE AND FEEDING OF YOUR PET HAM

The pet ham is one of the most intelligent of pets, often seeming almost human. But he can be one of the most difficult to keep. Only a person with a great deal of patience and understanding should attempt to keep a pet ham.

The following is a short guide to some of the most important things that you should know about caring for your pet ham.

LIVING AREA: YOUR PET HAM SHOULD HAVE A PRIVATE AREA OF HIS OWN, AN ENTIRE ROOM, IF POSSIBLE. WHERE HE WILL NOT BE DISTURBED. HE WILL SPEND MANY HAPPY HOURS ALONE THERE WITH HIS COLLECTION OF TREASURES. (BOXES, WIRES, BITS OF METAL, GLASS, PAPER, PLASTIC, ETC. THAT HE WILL BRING HOME REGULARLY). HE SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO CONFINE HIS ACTIVITIES TO THIS NEST ROOM IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE REST OF THE HOUSE FROM HIS NATURAL TENDENCIES TOWARD NOISE, CLUTTER AND MAKING HOLES IN THE WALLS.

EXPENSES: RAISING YOUR PET HAM CAN TURN INTO AN EXPENSIVE HOBBY. BUT, UNLIKE MOST PETS, THE PET HAM CAN BE TRAINED TO WORK OUTSIDE THE HOME FOR SHORT PERIODS AND SO BRING IN ENOUGH MONEY TO COVER PART OR ALL OF HIS EXPENSES.

FEEDING: THE WELL BEHAVED PET HAM WILL BE ABLE TO EAT WITH THE FAMILY ON OCCASION. BUT HE USUALLY FEELS MORE COMFORTABLE AND SECURE IF HE CAN TAKE MANY OF HIS MEALS IN THE PRIVACY OF HIS NEST ROOM. IT WILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT YOUR PET HAM IS KEPT WELL SUPPLIED WITH FOOD AND DRINKS DURING THE LONG PERIODS OF TIME THAT HE WILL SPEND ALONE IN THE NEST ROOM.

HOUSEKEEPING: PET HAMS CAN USUALLY BE TRAINED TO USE THE FAMILY BATHROOM FACILITIES.

OBEDIENCE TRAINING: MOST PET HAMS CAN BE TRAINED TO RESPOND TO A FEW SIMPLE COMMANDS. THE EASIEST FOR HIM BEING SIT AND SPEAK. ONCE YOUR PET HAM HAS LEARNED THESE COMMANDS, HE WILL SOMETIMES PRACTICE THEM ON HIS OWN FOR HOURS AT A TIME.

HEALTH CARE: THE PET HAM IS ESPECIALLY SUBJECT TO MINOR IRRITATIONS OF THE LOWER BACK AND SORE THROAT FROM TOO MUCH SITTING AND SPEAKING. THE SPECIAL CW BREED TENDS TO HAVE A TIRED WRIST RATHER THAN SORE THROAT, AND THE RTTY VERSIONS MAY SUFFER FROM TIRED AND HURTING EYES DEPENDING ON HIS AGE AND MONITOR.

TRAVELLING: YOUR PET HAM WILL GLADLY TRAVEL WITH YOU IN THE FAMILY CAR IF HE IS ALLOWED TO BRING SOME OF THE COLLECTION FROM HIS NEST ROOM. HIS FAVORITE TRIPS WILL BE TO PLACES WHERE HE CAN ASSOCIATE WITH OTHER PET HAMS FROM OTHER FAMILIES.

BREEDING: IF YOU PLAN TO BREED YOUR PET HAM, YOU SHOULD DO SO AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE AFTER YOU GET HIM. AS THE PET HAM MATURES HE BECOMES MORE AND MORE RELUCTANT TO ENGAGE IN ANY ACTIVITIES NOT CONNECTED WITH HIS NEST ROOM COLLECTION.

But the FCC said "it chose not to impose that limitation," because "otherwise the applicants choice of vanity call signs would be limited to ten percent or less of the call signs that would otherwise be assignable to the station."

A limitation based on a person's place of residence, moreover, could easily be circumvented by using a mailing address in another call sign region," the FCC said.

The ARRL has asked that specific call signs in a unique call sign block be made available to special events stations, and suggested the one-by-one call sign block for such stations. The FCC said that it would set aside the one-by-one block until it could address the matter later, in a separate proceeding.
