

The QSL Card

Three-letter messages that were sent by Morse code tell those who are receiving them quick notes. Designed to help them understand comments made from the sender as though they were formal quotes.

Q signals say a lot to those who are in the know about what a conversation had to say between two or more stations in a place called DX land. A land where RF signals often travel unseen!

When a station wants a confirmation of a contact that they have made to show others someday. It is a QSL card like the one seen <u>ABOVE</u> that stations pass on to each other to say;

"I received your signal quite well, my friend!" And here is each one of my recorded reports. "Hope to make contact again real soon!" Thus you have the confirmation of sorts.
