Cary ARC Minutes-June 24th 2004 Meeting

The June meeting of the Cary Amateur Radio Club was held on Thursday, June 24th, at the usual meeting place in the basement of the White Plains Methodist Church.

Reports:

Secretary Report- Keith, W4KAZ briefly reviewed May minutes.

Treasurer report- Herb, W3HL, gave a brief review of the financial standing. He noted that final payment for the Swapfest mailing, and final payment to Town of Cary for rental of the Swapfest had both been disbursed.

Old Business

Swapfest

Swapfest 2004 discussion began with reports from Larry, KD4HSL, and Herb, W3HL on Swapfest marketing at the Durham hamfest. Keith, W4KAZ, reported on marketing at the Winston-Salem hamfest.

Will, K4IWW noted that table sales were brisk, better than 2003(which was a sellout). Paid reservations are looking good.

Herb, W3HL, reported that food items will be limited to biscuits (ham and sausage), drinks, and snack items. The outside group doing the food vending took a loss on burgers and hotdogs in 2003.

Larry, KD4HSL, presented a proposal for purchasing new signs, based on the new traffic patterns associated with the parking deck. Herb, reported the pricing quotes he had obtained on the suggested signs, and the club agreed to this one time expense.

New Business

Field Day—Herb, W3HL reported that the Bond park site had been given the okay by the Town of Cary. However, due to several members having other plans, there were not enough human resources available and committed to manning a 24-hour operation and the Cary ARC decided not to attempt to operate a station in 2004.

Ladder Line - Actual Impedance Measurements

This may be of some interest to you ladder line aficionados. Wes, N7WS, has published on-line his article "Balanced Lines in Current Amateur Practice" which also appears in the sixth "Antenna Compendium". This apparently is a work still in progress for Wes, as he has additional information posted on his website relating to his techniques and including additional information. He's done great work quantifying and tabulating the actual impedances and velocity factor of commonly available 450 and 300-ohm ladder lines.

Hopefully, the cable and wire vendors who serve the Amateur market will pick up on this information, and check with Wes that they might include it on their own websites. Until then, Wes has done the Amateur community a service by making his findings available directly.

FCC Sets New Vanity Fee Start Date: August 6, 2004

The FCC has announced that the new Amateur Radio vanity call sign regulatory fee of \$20.80 for the 10-year license term will go into effect August 6. Applicants for amateur vanity call signs will continue to pay the \$16.30 fee per vanity call sign application received by FCC until the new fee goes into effect. The FCC says it expects to collect close to \$162,000 from 7800 Amateur Radio vanity call sign applicants during Fiscal Year 2004. BPL News

Alliant Energy, In Cedar Rapids, Iowa, has decided to end its BPL tests. Their company spokesman cited "regulatory uncertainty" and other "unspecified technical issues"

So, nobody is yet admitting that current BPL systems producing 20 over 9 interference is "harmful", but it would seem that the rosy pictures being painted by the BPL industry blowhards, fact-spinners, and advocates, are beginning to lose some of their blush when applied in real world settings.
