WA6KCP- Gary noted that he is working on getting the ships wire antennas put up. He is also working on having a sign installed at the Park for the ship, to increase exposure. Leon is a volunteer for the Park and will help get this done.

WB6NOV - Ken made a short presentation on the ship's electrical system relating the generation of A/C power.

Dolores Hembree made a presentation on the "Richmond Radio Alert" organization. "This group is associated with the Richmond Police Department and provides training and communication services during disasters. They use "CB" and family service radios and interface with the local ham groups. The group was started in 1976. They are organized by neighborhood councils.

WA6KCP- Gary noted that the radio gear in the warehouse still needs to be moved into the #3 hold.
