It was 24th June 2003 that I started my journey to my mother land Sri Lanka. Apart from all other times that I have gone there, this time was very special as I had in mind that I am a radio ham from Denmark. It is not really necessary that I have to mention, I am a member of our local club SARS here in Loland F. I was packed with information about SARS with various activities performed here in Denmark to pass on to the Srilankan Hams, most of the events in SARS I have participated, getting together at our club locality in Nykøbing F, contests, grill party events etc!. With all this I have to highlight the event of handing over the 2 meter repeater station to our friendship club Radio Society of Sri Lanka (RSSL) I offered a dinner in appreciation, to the officials of SARS at my place the so called QTH. I made a short video clip so that I will show it to Srilankan hams when I go there. This will also be a special cultural event to show those Sri Lankans how a Dane packs their food in great hummer, sipping the light beverage of alcohol and sweet waters to gulp down the food. I have to stress the point that with the generous request of the fellow Hams my XYL and I made real Sri Lankan dishes with devil HOT taking care of the one who does not like HOT we made the same dish a bit LITE. From the safe side of things I made a dish of Danish style Fricadellas and kept it very near a guy I know very well that he might not like our hot food! For our surprise the most hot items were quickly disappeared from the table.

(Those guys were confused when they heard our Danish friends jabbering in Danish!)They were very keen to see and here my translations, I could see some of them were very sharply focused to the subject! I must mention that I was really rejoiced as one of my old college Mr. Tisil Cooray was with the crowd. It gave all my memories during the Civil Aviation life working together with high power transmitting and professional receiving systems! (Bit of a gossip He!) So it came to an end at last! The whole house was clapping and lots of them came and greeted me. Then, came a surprised event! I was presented a wonderful gift to give Allan also some tokens to myself. The last event was they took me to Sri Lanka s most expensive hotel for a dinner! Scotch on the rocks was served as an appetiser after the dinner was served! At last they drove me to my dwelling. Letters to the Editor

I am writing this letter to give you my opinion on facts that I believe are important for the existence of amateur radio in this country. I hope you will pay your due attention to them.

Amateur radio faces greatest challenges today than ever before. Wire communication that originated in eighteen thirties has been replaced by communication by means of electromagnetic radiation in eighteen seventies. The former is developing now making great challenges to the latter. Threat comes from persons who got amateur radio licenses for different objectives. Amateur radio is for those who like to do experiments and communicate by means of guided electromagnetic radiation through free space. Organisation of true amateurs is necessary to protect this hobby. Each fact I like to mention is given below, briefly.

(1) Any attempt to abolish Morse test or to reduce the speed of the test will be disastrous to future of amateur radio in this island. CW is not only a mode of HF communication but also a method of developing skill and discipline. Although I totally object, it is up to you to decide. I sincerely request you to observe reaction of VU, 9M, HS and AP to recent ITU ruling before taking a final decision. If Morse test is to be totally abolished then appropriate steps have to be taken to prevent downgrading of 4S7. If CW is to be replaced by new digital techniques then introduction of a new question paper on digital communication techniques will be most appropriate.

(2) hope that activity of RSSL must be increased in an orderly way. I propose you and house to form committees each headed by a council member. These

committees may be the examinations committee, committee of popularisation of amateur radio, ethical practices and finance.

(3) Urgent action is necessary to abolish 2 m jokers club, telephone club, gang club, hatred club and policemen's club and to form 2 m amateur club.

(4) Increase of annual membership fee needs careful consideration. I give you annual membership fee and life membership fee of some recognised professional organisations below for your kind reference.

Sri Lanka Association of Advancement of Science: annual 300/- life 2500/-
Institute of Chemistry, Ceylon: annual 350 to 500 life 3500 (all in Sri Lankan currency, i.e. Rs)

You will find that life membership fee of RSSL is already higher than these professional bodies. I believe it is inappropriate for an amateur club. Annual membership fee of Institute of Engineers and Sri Lanka Institute of Architects is however 1430/- and 2000/- respectively. You are aware that membership in them enables one to earn several million rupees a year. I think we must take necessary steps to increase our membership and find suitable other measures to increase income.

I hope you will pay attention to the facts mentioned above and take appropriate action.
