

Although sightless from early childhood, Jim ably proved that with courage, perseverance, and proper assistance, blind persons can overcome much of their disability and become active, participating members of society.

One of the pleasant surprises of the evening was the awarding of a "Diploma" to Joyce Walters for her continued assistance in our club activities by typing the copies of SCCARA-GRAM for the past several years. Joyce was surprised, and your publisher and editor were greatly pleased by the thoughtfulness of President Bill, W6ZM, in presenting her with this recognition.

During the business meeting <u>Dick Barrett</u>, <u>W6CFK</u>, presented SCCARA with a <u>Bicentennial</u> <u>Award</u> for our association's involvement in local bicentennial activities.


This year Frank Glass will have his class at Camden High School (Union Ave. at Camden) on Thursday evenings 7 to 10 p.m. beginning Sept. 16.
