Copied from ARRL Bulletin NR 59 From ARRL Headquarters Newington Ct. Jul 27, 1985 "Actions taken at the 1985 second Board of Directors Meeting. Our W6ZM was there.

"THE BOARD ADOPTED A REDUCED ARRL MEMBERSHIP RATE OF 6 DOLLARS AND 25 CENTS PER YEAR FOR YOUTHS UNDER 13 YEARS OF AGE. AND A RATE OF 12 DOLLARS AND 50 CENTS PER YEAR FOR UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE."

"THE ARRL EXCUTIVE VP IS TO SUBMIT TO FCC A PRELIMINARY PROPOSAL TO PROVIDE IT ASSISTANCE IN ASSIGNING AMATEUR CALLSIGNS".

"THERE IS SOME POSSIBILITY OF BETTER HF DX CONDITIONS IN LATE 1985 THAN WERE EXPERIENCED IN THE SAME MONTHS OF 1984. THAT WAS A TIME OF EXCEPTIONALLY LOW SOLAR ACTIVITY FOR LESS THAN 9 YEARS INTO CYCLE 21".
