The Club will pay the tip and room fee so your expense will be the cost of the dinner only. More info in the newsletter plus check our hotline at 249-6909.



When first starting on CW the first rule is to LISTEN. Listen for a while. You will start hearing all kinds of signals. You should make yourself a worksheet of the basic things you want to say. It could be:

CQ CQ CQ DE YOUR CALL and then listen. Try it a few times.

When you get a reply, then send: TNX FER CALL, YR SIG HR IS 599

QTH IS (YOUR QTH).

NAME IS (YOUR NAME). HOW COPY? You only need to repeat your call every 10 minutes. You can then talk about your equipment, weather etc. Now about NCN (Northern Calif.

Net) which is an ARRL affiliated

net. The NCN is on at 2100. To break in send: BK. When acknowledged, give your call, qth and who you would like to contact. Only send at the speed that you can copy. The "other" operator will respond at the same speed. The net control may ask you to go U5 (up five) to do your QSO.

#### N6WQC THIS KC6SOC...

"Thank you, Atlantis. You've been the center of our studies for the last six weeks. We are thrilled! And, even though it's Saturday, we have children and parents all here. We have five children waiting to talk to you...", said Carol Greenwald, Principal of Norwood Creek Elementary School in San Jose, Calif.

She was communicating with the space shuttle, Atlantis via Two meter amateur radio station being operated by Terry Young, KC6SOC as a participant in the SAREX Mission. As the callsign tells you, Terry is a relative newcomer to Ham Radio. But, he brought the same zeal and enthusiasm to the hobby that has fueled it since it began.

When Terry heard about the possibility of having students from his son's school talk to astronauts on Atlantis, he immediately set out on his own mission. His mission was to get his school on the list of scheduled contacts. He did it! Norwood Creek Elementary became one of only nine U.S. schools to be included in the Mission.

His next task was to coordinate the revival of the school's closed circuit TV system, so the whole school could witness the event. He then turned to reading Mission Control's frequency, antenna and system recommendations. His last task was to familiarize the Kids with talking on the Ham Radio. Finally, everything was set and excitement grew as they anticipated the big day.

Friday, March 27th, the big day finally arrived. Everyone was there; the press; local TV; ARRL Vice Director, Brad Wyatt, K6WR and many, many parents.

They planned to establish contact with Atlantis, have the school's principal say a few words and then each child would talk to, and ask a question of the astronaut. Problem was, they couldn't establish a two way QSO. To everyone's dismay, the Shuttle could hear the signal from the school, but the school couldn't hear signal from the shuttle.

What a disappointment! But in the true spirit of Amateur Radio, Terry contacted and negotiated with Mission Control and got them to agree to try again the following day. Meanwhile, Brad Wyatt contacted his longtime friend, Frank Glass, K6RQ and the pair of them prevailed upon the IBM ARC for the loan of an eight element, 2meter beam. They mounted it on a temporary mast and hustled it off to the school, where it would be turned by the "Armstrong method". "Nothing to it..Just like Field Day!" Frank commented.

We never dreamed there would be so many people there on Saturday. They all watched on closed circuit TV, as the children took turns talking with Atlantis. One really didn't know they were even there, until they poured into the school's courtyard to join the jubilant celebration.

The QSO lasted about six minutes as the shuttle sped across the sky at 18,000 MPH from coast of Alaska to the tip of Baja. It didn't take long. And the QSO: it went great! Not only was it "Q5" copy, but it was "full quieting" and crystal clear.

So it happened the way things sometimes do in ham radio. Not exactly the way they are planned, but with outstanding results!

Congratulations, Terry. You have touched the lives of these kids in a way they will never forget.

#### REMEMBERING "PROF" HAROLD

Contrary to some popular opinion, many of us know that the claim of KDKA as to being the first broadcast radio station is wrong. We know that Charles "Prof" Harold started the first radio broadcasts ever made and he started those broadcast in the heart of the Santa Clara Valley.

A recent article in the San Jose Mercury News attests to this, as a professor at San Jose tries to set the record straight. This isn't a first time happening, however. Gordon Grebb, a now retired San Jose State Professor at San Jose State and the University Chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, the national Journalism society, had a plaque placed at the location of the building where "Prof" Harold did his work. I know, because I helped Professor Grebb with this project since I was active in SDX at the time.

But that wasn't the first time I heard about "Prof" Harold. I joined SCCARA in August 1946 in a regular meeting held in one of the rooms of the Civic Auditorium. In those days the club held alternate meetings, a regular business meeting one month, and a dinner meeting the next month. At the time, the dinners were held at Vahl's in Alviso.

I attended my first SCCARA Dinner Meeting in September of 1946 and "Prof" Harold was the speaker. It was one of the most interesting meetings that I attended during my many years with SCCARA. I was new to ham radio and had no idea of what had gone on in San Jose over the first quarter of the 20th Century, but I soon learned. Many of our founding members were students of "Prof" Harold's radio school and were involved with what became Radio Station KQW in San

Jose.

In the 30's us "kids" knew all about KQW because every year they had our Hester School Glee Club come and sing a few numbers over the radio. At the time my 5th Grade Teacher, Mabel Madson was the Director and I can remember going down town to sing on KQW. It was a big thing and our parents and all of our friends tuned in. Boy we thought we were real "celebrities."

Interestingly enough, we seldom listened to KQW because it was a local radio station at the time. We listened to the network stations in San Francisco because they had all the good shows, "The Lone Ranger," "Lum and Abner," Amos and Andy" and of course "I Love a Mystery."

In the late 1940's CBS bought KQW and moved the studios to San Francisco and the transmitters to the North Bay. The old station was located at 2nd & San Antonio Streets as I recall. Later the call letters were changed to KCBS. I really didn't know how much "Prof" Harold did for radio and for that matter for amateur radio and SCCARA. When I attended my first SCCARA dinner meeting I learned a lot of local radio history.

It's a good example of how much I've learned over the years as a member of SCCARA. Every meeting has featured and informative and interesting speaker. Well most were anyway. I learned enough about radio and electronics to teach the subject in high school.

I bet that Dick Barrett could tell us all about the old timers who were members of SCCARA and attended "Prof" Harold's Radio School. That should make another interesting and informative talk.


