

REPEATER COMMITTEE REPORT

The following QST was received by the club. I thought there might be some club members who might be interested.

QST

PL (subaudible tone access) will be implemented on the 145.23(-) repeater beginning the first week of December 1992. The PL will be 100 Hz. The Palo Alto 145.23 repeater will continue to be an open repeater, welcoming all hams to share the use of the machine. The purpose of this QST is to provide an adequate notice to Bay Area hams that may not now have PL capability on their rigs to acquire that capability before PL access is implemented so that the 5.23 repeater will still be available to all radio amateurs.

The Palo Alto machine presently TRANSMITS a 100 Hz subaudible tone to enable hams with tone squelch to listen only to this repeater. This has proved helpful in eliminating cable TV interference and propagation from the Sacramento area.

Most of the new two-meter radios have PL built in. Implementing PL may be just a matter of rereading your users' manual and following the instructions therein. For radios without PL, there area a number of companies who sell miniature PL boards. These are about the size of a postage stamp, so they will fit into most HTs. These can be purchased for less than \$30.

After the first week in December, access to the emergency agencies via the 5.23 autopatch will require the use of 100 Hz PL tone.

Now for news regarding the SCCARA repeater relocation. We are still awaiting formal acceptance by the City of San Jose of the city-wide comm system installed by Motorola prior to being allowed access to the Alum Rock repeater vault. Our relocation to that site is also dependant on whether there is a possibility of our repeater causing any intermod products (3rd, 5th, and 7th) which might interfere with radios existing there currently. I know we have been talking about this move for over a year. Unfortunately, we will have to wait a little longer for this acceptance process to be complete.

New Equipment

At the SCCARA board meeting on Sept. 28 a motion was made, and passed, for the club to purchase a new VHF multimode transceiver. The brand and model have yet to be decided, but the new rig will allow all-mode operation on the 2 meter band, and possibly 440 as well. This new rig will allow club members to try some new modes of communication, including: Mode-A satellite operation, VHF contesting on SSB and CW, VHF packet radio, and DXing via tropospheric ducting. The rig would also be available for use during emergencies and natural disasters.

Mike Marneris, K8ERL, will give a brief talk at the regular club meeting Oct. 12 about the various rigs that are available and what each would cost and offer. The club will then vote on the purchase.

C.D.F. Chili Recipe submitted by Barbra Britten

- 1 lb. ground beef browned and drained, placed in a large pot.
- 3 1 lb. cans of pinto beans including the liquid.
- 1 1 lb. can of kidney beans including the liquid.
- 1 large can of whole peeled/cut tomatos including liquid.
- 1 jar of SALSA (this is where the spices come from. Use HOT or MILD, to suit.)

Bring to a boil for about 5 minutes, turn down to a simmer, and cover. Cook for at least 1 hour more, stirring occasionally.

This is the recipe for the chili Barbara made on Friday night prior to Field Day this year. It is very tasty and easy to prepare. A minimum of utensils and plates is used during the preparation (can opener, spoon, and a large pot) or at meal time (a coffee cup and spoon). Serves 6-12 depending on serving size.

H.R. 73 - S. 1372 -- SPECTRUM PROTECTION ACTS. Now is the time to mount a final push to get this legislation passed in Congress. The end of this Congressional Session is rapidly approaching. This legislation must be passed by the end of the session in December 1992 or it dies. Then new legislation would need to be introduced in the next Congress. Please inundate your Congressperson and Senators with letters. Let's really put on a push to get this legislation to the floor of Congress and passed. Check the July 1992 *QST* for the status of your Representative and Senators with respect to their support of H. R. 73 and S. 1372.

STS 47 - SAREX AND SCHOOLS. Two of the three schools in the U.S. scheduled for contacts with the *Endeavour* were in the Pacific Division. On Sunday September 13, 1992, 30 students in the Santa Cruz participated in a successful 8 minute contact. This group involved elementary through high school students. For this contact the entire operation was done by the student Amateurs with no adult Amateur help. This may be the first time this has happened. Questions were directed to Jay Apt by three young Amateurs. Thanks to Wayne Thalls KB6KN for information in this report. The second school contact in the Division was with students at McKinley High School in Honolulu, Hawaii. Mission Specialist Jay Apt, N5QWL, reports a successful contact with the students at McKinley High School.

If any school teachers want to become involved in Space Shuttle contacts for your school, contact Rosalie White, WA1STO, at the ARRL Educational Activities Branch, 225 Main Street, Newington, CT 06111 for information on the process to get your school scheduled for a SAREX contact. Rosalie will be at Pacificon '92, October 16-18, 1992 in Concord CA.

CANADIAN AMATEUR RADIO GROUPS MERGE. Members of the Canadian Radio Relay League and the Canadian Amateur Radio Federation have voted to merge. The new unified organization will be called *Radio Amateurs of Canada*. Their first executive meeting as the RAC was October 3, 1992.

PACIFICON '92. October 16-18, 1992 are the dates. Concord California is the place. There will be 30 commercial exhibits highlighted by ICOM and Kenwood. There will be forums Friday through Sunday. ARRL President George Wilson III, W4OYI, will attend as will ARRL First Vice President Rod Stafford, KB6ZV. Gordon West, WB6NOA, will speak at the banquet in addition to presenting forums. ARRL General Counsel Chris Imlay, N3AKD, and Educational Activities Manager Rosalie White, WA1STO, will be present. See you there.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS: Since the beginning of the DXCC conversion project on October 1, 1991, the DXCC desk has converted more than 2,800,000 country credits. When the computerization of the DXCC records, it was estimated that 3 million country credits would be converted during the first year. They are close to their estimate.
