

Nov. Scott KB6UOO gave a presentation on Cellular Telephone.

Dec. Christmas dinner. The dinner was held at Renzos on Friday 12/18. SCCARA picked up the tip and room fee plus provided an assortment of gifts for the drawing. The new officers were sworn in.

Public Awareness and Classes

Jim WE6V headed the weekly code classes held at the Santa Clara Adult Ed. Center. The classes were moved from Tuesday to Thursday evenings mid year. Classes run from 1800-1930. SCCARA has business cards which are available to all members. They contain key phone numbers and frequencies. We also maintain a hotline. This number gives basic club info and allows recording of messages. We also added a SCCARA Banner this year for use at functions. Doug WN6U gave several classes at the Red Cross covering the operation of AMTOR and RTTY.

Nets

Joe WA6DXP maintains the Monday evening two meter net. Wally KA6YMD maintains the Thursday evening 10 meter net. The net is generally run from the Red Cross.

Repeaters

The chairman of the repeater committes is Stan WA6VJY. The club has a two meter repeater on 146.385+. It is situated in the Mount Hamilton area and provides good coverage of the South Bay. Autodial and autopatch is offered to members.

A 440 mhz repeater is also maintained. It is located on top of a local hospital and continues to operate. It is likely in 93 that both repeaters will move into a City of San Jose Vault also located in the Mount Hamilton area. The club also has a new two meter antenna to be installed at the new location. The City of San Jose has loaned the club equipment to modernize our 440 mhz system. We will not "own" it but will have it for long term use.

Field Day

Doug WN6U was the chair for Field Day. It was once again held at Mount Madonna Park. We used Gary WB6YRU's logging program. Dave N6JQJ provided the City of Gilroy comm van to house the CW station. Saturday dinner and Sunday breakfast was provided by the San Jose Chapter of the Red Cross. This was also an exercise for the group responsible for mass feeding. Dinner cost was \$10 and overnite stay was \$8 per person. We ran 3A and finished in the upper third in the contest.

Trailer

Our club mobile HF tower is housed at a member home. We replaced the tires this year. The trailer carries two HF beam antennas.

Flea Markets

Gary WB6YRU headed the monthly flea market effort. We cleared over \$500. Monies go directly to our repeater fund.

Profits were down this year since we did not receive many "big ticket" items. A locker is maintained at a storage facility.

Lou WA6QYS headed the June sponsorship of the Foothill Flea Market. This was our first year at it. We cleared over \$2300 and had excellent club participation.

Red Cross Station

It was expected that the Red Cross would move in 92. This never came to pass. Maybe 93... Added a 4BTV vertical antenna and tied it into the Collins KWM380 which had been donated by Frank Quement many years ago. We continue to use the Yeasu FT757 tied to a six element beam for 10-15-20 plus a dipole for 40. We added two computers. Stan WA6VJY was able to have ESL donate an IBM XT with EGA. Bill N6ZPC donated a 50mb SCSI drive and controller. Frank AA6LL sold the club a 286 system for \$150. We added a VGA monitor, 3.5" floppy plus Bill N6ZPC also donated a 50 mb drive and controller for it. The club purchased a PK232 tnc. This unit was added to the Yeasu FT757 and allows RTTY, AMTOR etc.

Equipment Consolidation

Gary WB6YRU had made up a complete list (as far as we know) of club owned equipment and literature. The club rents a storage locker to house club archives and equipment

Most of our equipment has been marked using an etching device.

Membership

Our annual dues have remained at \$15 for individual, \$20 for family and \$5 for students for many years and will continue for 93. We dropped 50 members for non payment of dues in April which left our membership at 155. We have since built up to 185. Our average meeting has 35-50 people in attendance with dinner meetings going much higher. The club attained Special Service club status in June of 92. In this area we supported the Boy Scout Jamboree on the Air plus donated to the 22 Crew in New York City.

Financial

The club maintains four separate accounts. They are the Repeater account, Pacificon account, basic savings and our checking account. We also maintain a safe deposit box plus a post office box.

Newsletter

George WA6O was the newsletter editor for 1992. Bob KB6OHO provided the photos and Tony K6MOB got the mail to the post office. Monthly cost for the newsletter was approximately \$100.

If you have not, contact me by phone (408-275-0735) or on the repeater.

I cannot overemphasize the necessity for identifying yourself prior to using the autopatch/autodial features of the repeater. A user who doesn't identify him/herself runs the risk of having their phone patch terminated or having the repeater turned off by a control operator. We have no way of knowing by the sound of your touchtones or carrier who you are unless you tell us. Unlicensed (illegal) operators cannot be tolerated as they jeopardize the club callsign if permitted to use our equipment. If we can't tell who you are, we have to assume that what we hear is an illegal transmission.

AutoPatch codes will be changing the end of the month (January). I plan on mailing out the new codes to all who have signed up for them around the 20th or so. If you have signed up for Autopatch or Autodial privileges and have not received your new codes by the 31st. of January, please contact me.


