

Larry Ammon and Yardley Beers Memorial Scholarship (BARC) 2009

The Boulder Amateur Radio Club (BARC) announces that it will award a scholarship of \$1000 during the year 2009 and is now accepting applications for this scholarship. The name of the scholarship is the Larry Amman and Yardley Beers Memorial (BARC) Scholarship. The deadline for the receipt of applications is **June 15, 2009**.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Applicants must be full time high school (senior year) or college students who are 25 years of age or younger as of the closing date of this scholarship announcement (**June 15, 2009**). High school applicants must be seniors who will be entering college in September of the upcoming academic year (September, 2009). The definition of full time student will follow the definition of the college that he or she is attending. College students must be planning to continue their studies in the upcoming academic year (September, 2009).
2. Applicants must be residents of Boulder County *or* be current members *or* former members of the Boulder Amateur Radio Club Junior (BARC Junior). This means that if an applicant is not a resident of Boulder County, but he or she is a current member or former member of BARC Junior, then he/she is eligible to apply for this BARC scholarship.
3. Applicants must be licensed radio amateurs.

Selection Criteria

This scholarship will be awarded based on the following selection criteria:

1. Academics/Grade Point Average (20 points).
 What are the main courses you have taken and what is your grade point average?
2. Extra curricular activities or service involving school/community/church, or other organization (20 points).
 What extra curricular or service activities have you participated in? What contributions have you made?
3. Employment experience (20 points).
 What employment experiences have you had and what have you learned from these experiences?
4. Amateur radio related activities (20 points).

Please describe your amateur radio related activities. What type or class of license do you hold and what type of operating have you done? What modes and bands have you utilized? Please mention what radio organizations you are in and the extent of your participation. If you have an amateur radio station set up in your home at the present time, please describe your rig.

5. Future plans and special circumstances (20 points).

Please describe your future plans and any special circumstances, which apply to your situation, such as overcoming difficulties and special needs.

How To Apply

To apply for this scholarship, please submit a completed BARC Scholarship Application. A blank application form is attached to this BARC Scholarship Announcement. The deadline for receiving scholarship applications in connection with this announcement is **June 15, 2009**. If you mail your BARC Scholarship application, please allow adequate time for the package to be delivered through the mail. Adequate time for mailing would generally mean mailing your application package seven to ten days before **June 15, 2009**. Application packages can also be hand-delivered. In any event, applications are due on **June 15, 2009** and must be received by that date.
