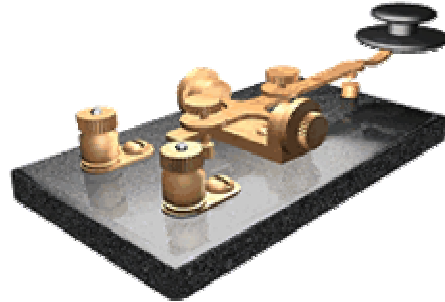

**CONSTITUTION
OF THE
SCIOTO VALLEY AMATEUR RADIO CLUB**

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be the Scioto Valley Amateur Radio Club.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this corporation shall be to advance the art and knowledge of amateur radio, to unite the interest of the members, to improve standards of operating, to take such action as necessary for preservation of amateur radio privileges and the furtherance of such amateur radio ideals, all to the utmost interest of public welfare.

ARTICLE III

Membership

There shall be three classes of membership in this corporation, which are:

1. Regular – This class shall be a voting membership open only to duly renewable licensed radio amateurs who subscribe to the purposes of this corporation as set forth in Article II of this constitution.
2. Associate – This class shall be non-voting membership open to unlicensed persons interested in the purposes of this corporation as stated in article II of this constitution.
3. Honorary – This class shall be a voting membership. This membership shall require approval by a majority vote of the regular members. Or to amateurs who have been paid members for no less than the last five (5) consecutive years and have obtained the age of 65 years.
