I will admit it, it seems to be a recurring theme with me lately, to write "can you believe the _______ is almost over, and it's nearly ______"? We all have busy lives, so we have to enjoy radio as much as we can, whenever we can. Fortunately, 2016 will see the National Parks on the Air to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the National Park System. Unlike certain Worked All States nets that only recognize the 59 National Parks within the United States, this event will also include the National Battlefields, Monuments, Historical Sites and a number of other categories totaling 434 as I type this. And just like the ARRL Centennial Challenge, it will include a leader board, allowing users to see how they compare with other hams.

This will also be one of the discussion items at the December meeting, but OCARS has made arrangements to operate a special event station at the River Raisin National Battlefield Park. This site was chosen as it is only one of five in Michigan and located in Monroe, is also the closest to Oakland County. What I find very interesting about the site as it is the only National Park located at a War of 1812 Battlefield site.

More importantly, kudos goes to the eight OCARS members who have already submitted their logs in behalf of the club. These include:

Another important item, club elections will be held at the December meeting, our tradition that goes back many years. Running for re-election will be our Treasurer, John Eldred N8FNN; our secretary Scott Craig N2OPQ; and for president, myself. We will, of course, accept any nominations from the floor.

Lastly, perhaps a very important item for all of us, not just in Oakland County, but the entire United States.... There has been some progress with Amateur Radio Parity Act (S. 1685). On November 18, it was endorsed by the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science and Technology. I will bring some printed letters for Senators Debbie Stabenow and Gary Peters and members are invited to sign one of each, which will forwarded to the ARRL when they go to Washington to lobby for this bill.

And a final reminder, ARRL dues will be increasing to \$49 effective in January. I know many of you may be on fixed incomes, and to soften the news a little, renewals will be accepted at the \$39 rate until the end of December. John Eldred N8FNN (OCARS Treasurer) is authorized to accept payment in behalf of the League, and for each year of dues collected, the club gets to keep \$2. So if you would like to renew your dues for 2016, you can help our club out at the same time.



Clarkston Repeater History Tim Pepper, K8NWD (CRA Trustee)
