- It seems like just a few days ago we had a Siren Test and now it is time for another one. The next test will be on May 6th at 1:00 p.m. So far this year we have had a lot of sirens checked in the Northwest Section of Oakland County. We are still have a long ways to go from having all of our siren checked. We have 86 sirens to check, and so far we have had 30 sirens checked. You people have done a great job but the work is not over.
- I just read an article about a location down South that had a working "Early Warning Siren system" but because the storm came up so fast the system did not give the people a very long early warning. We are somewhat lucky because National Weather Station is right here in White Lake. This is to our advantage but only if the siren all work. The Statewide test of the systems was much better this year and we even had one of own hams on the broadcast talking about the sirens. That person was Ted Davis, N8ZSA. Ted is the Director for our area for Weather and through many years of hard work he has helped make our involvement better and our knowledge better when its comes to watching and reporting the weather. He does this and he also is out there each time to check a siren.
- There are quite a few of you that are just as involved as Ted and I can never thank you enough for all your help. It only takes a few minutes to check a siren during the test and then report it condition into the net on the Clarkston Repeater (146.840 MHz with a 100 Hz tone) I try to start check ins about 12:00 p.m. so if someone has not signed up for a siren beforehand they can do it then. I will gladly help people with assignments beforehand if they would email me at <u>kb8pod@att.net</u> <u>or kb8pod@arrl.net</u>. I can also be reached by phone at (248) 421-2617.
- It may not seem like much when you check a siren but each siren has a radius of 1 mile coverage and we have a lot of outdoor areas in the Northwest Section that can hear the sirens. At least twice while I have been our checking sirens I have been able to warn people on horses.
