Minutes of the June 25, 2014 regular meeting of the Central Illinois Radio Club (CIRC)

The regularly scheduled meeting of CIRC was called to order by President, Grant Zehr (AA9LC) at 7:00 PM, June 25, 2014.

Members present at the meeting then introduced themselves by name and call sign. Guests present included Jim Austin (KE7MVO & Sonia Austin (W7WTE) of Yuma, AZ. Ed Deutsch's young house guest from Germany, Mathew, was also present.

It was noted that the minutes of the regular May 2014 meeting, as recorded by Josh Golladay (KC9UJS), had been sent by email to all members on the CIRC reflector. On motion by Tom Planer (KJ9P) and second Gary Huber (AB9M), the minutes of the May 2014 regular meeting were unanimously approved.

Treasurer Norm Huber (N9ZKS) submitted a written report to the members that indicated a balance on hand of \$2,181.48 as of meeting date. On motion by Greg Kellerman (KC9WVR), seconded by Tom Planer, the Treasurer's Report was unanimously approved.

Jim Baker (WB9EDL) reported on the club's participation in the Wheelers event held on June 14, 2014. A number of members participated and provided communication, helped fix flats, handed out water and other services to the 280+ Wheeler participants. Norm Huber reported that the Miles of Smiles organization had requested the club's help with similar services for their Downs to Gibson City event the last Saturday in July. A discussion of repeater coverage for that route then ensued.

Under new business, the Members discussed getting a new Banner with logo. It was proposed that the banner be constructed of vinyl and that an area of the banner have removable patches to name specific events, such as "Field Day", Science Fair, etc.

Mike Sallee (KC9FWL) then led a discussion of Field Day planning and preparation. It was noted that a committee, headed by Nettie Hanson, Kathy Huber and Susan Benjamin would arrange for a 7 AM breakfast at the Field Day site. Various members were assigned duties to bring supplies or perform certain actions. Grant Zehr, Mike Sallee and Norm Huber were assigned to do the radio interview with WJBC. It was decided that because of liability and insurance concerns, the club would not use a rental bucket lift for a tower support this year.

On motion by Dennis Mills (KE9UA), seconded by Ed Deutsch (KC9GF), the meeting was unanimously adjourned.

**In the hopper of Congress is a measure shorthanded as HR-4969. The full title is the Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2014. An FCC study was mandated by Congress in 2012 on "the uses and capabilities of Amateur Radio Service communications in emergencies and disaster relief" (NOT "public service communications", thank you very much!). One of the obstacles to Amateur participation in EmComm and such are the increasing prevalence of conditions and restrictions (CC&Rs) covenants. incorporated by home owners associations (HOAs) in new communities. A lot of new subdivisions have these things as a condition to the sale. Frankly, many of them contain severe restrictions if not outright prohibition of outdoor antennas. This constricts our ability to operate and leaves many with indoor or attic or no antennas. The FCC, in reporting the study results to Congress, essentially said that if they were ordered by Congress to extend PRB-1's 'reasonable accommodation' standard to HOAs and CC&Rs, the Commission would do so. HR-4969 does that. It was introduced by Illinois' own Adam Kinzinger (R-IL/16) and Connecticut's Joe Coonnecticut's Joe Courtney (D-CT/2). Right now, the push is to get as many co-sponsors on board as possible, so as to make passage inevitable and support overwhelming. The playbook the League's is on website at http://www.arrl.org/hr-4969. Note that we're still using the

same methods as in the past: letters go to HQ for collection and are hand delivered by our lobbyist to the individual Congresspeople in person. This also bypasses the toxin and hazmat screening delay that occurs if you mail comments directly. We need all hands on deck for this one again. I know from my conversations with you at events that this is a big concern of many. Please pitch in as you have so well in the past and let's get this done.
