Phase 3D, the long awaited amateur satellite, is said to be ready for its launch in French Guiana this July aboard an Arienne Rocket giving amateurs a satellite that is supposed to stay in the same orbit and be in the same place every 48 hours if plans are followed giving amateurs a easy to track bird.

A new FM repeater is on the air and the owner is requesting that people use it or he will turn it off to conserve fuel. UO-14 is a former store and forward satellite thats store system failed and has been turned into a single channel fm repeater. the uplink is 145.975mhz and downlink is 435.070mhz.

Adrian Robinson G7WFM of Nottingham, England is the first Amateur radio station in the world to be granted permission to link his station to the Internet using a 70cm (431.075mhz) simplex frequency. He received a special variance from the uk's regulatory Agency.
