LETTERS FROM THE EDITORS

PRESENTATION

CLUB ANTENNA

A discussion on needing a new antenna for contests and club events was made at the August meeting. Mr. Paul made mention he is holding a 6 element antenna for the club with tower at his home in Thibodaux. The club then asked if this antenna may be modified and mention was made it possibly could be done but none had done before. So we will either use this antenna or proceeds from sell of this antenna and a donation fund that was started that night will fund for a new three element, three band yagi with cost estimates to be at about \$300 with tax for a hygain from radio shack as quoted by Freddie KD5FIX.

Nothing was done on this but a proposal that was to be proposed at our canceled September meeting, of Donations to cover the cost of a box in Morgan City for one year until our hopeful status change happens, has been made by Mike KC5OKP and will be brought up at the October meeting.

REPEATERS

The report on our repeaters is disappointing this time around. All club repeaters are off the air at this time due to problems. The 6 meter is still off awaiting Huey N5DVI to have time to check into it "hanging up" problem. The 440 is off air due to no power at the Mr. Charlie from financial problems at the repeater site involving the Mr.Charlie foundation and the city of Morgan City for services. And our 2 meter repeater frequency has been given to another group in Baton Rouge when it was proven we didn't have ours up in time (2 years is given between coordination and being online). So the hunt for a new frequency and a renewed urgency for a 2 meter repeater is on our minds.

Mr. Newton N5BOD's 146.745 and 146.910 are functioning normal.
