The Club Logo controversy-The conclusion

As many of you have heard, there was a slight controversy over the alterations to the logo for the Field Day 2002 t-shirts between the club and Joel KC5RFO, the logo designer. After a long phone discussion between Joel KC5RFO and Guy W5ZIM several things had become clear.

- Joel did not know about the t-shirts until late May whereas the club had thought he had known for several months.
- The logo was a donation to the club. The club has a right to use it as it sees fit, he just asks to be the one to alter the logo design.
- The messages that were being received by the club about Joel's feelings and or thoughts were not his own. Someone was speaking for Joel without his knowledge or permission.

A vote was initially supposed to take place for the August 2002 meeting. However, being that the usual meeting attendance was present; a motion was made by Guy W5ZIM to open up this vote to all members, past and present, to get as accurate a sampling of opinions on this issue as possible. A form was placed on the club website for all members to voice their opinions and the final vote was postponed until September in order to give all members a chance to respond.

Overall, there was a sizable turnout of voting for this issue. Eight emails were received and ten members were present at the September meeting. Ultimately, it was decided to keep the present logo as is with 17 for and 1 opposed. However, it was discussed and decided by a majority that the club has a right to choose whom it sees fit for the altering of the logo.

Lastly, a motion was made by Noel KB5GON to adopt a "secondary" logo to use for things like shirts, etc. if ever there comes about another controversy centered around the altering or reproduction stage of the current logo. The current logo would remain as the "official" logo and on the website but the "secondary" logo would be used for special events like Field Day t-shirts etc. The motion was passed unanimously. Suggestions and ideas are now being taken for the "secondary" logo design.

KD5NOY's Reflections

To try to get something going..I have included a letter Mark KD5NOY originally wanted as his editorial this month but I have included it here instead. It is my goal to show some of the things that are farmiliar to most of us through the eyes of a new ham. Hope you enjoy!

Recently I was scanning 17 meters ,Near 18.148 I encountered what I have come to learn as splatter, many stations on a nearby frequency all trying for the same contact. As I dialed up the band, I ran into a pileup beyond belief, operators from all parts on one freq. and faintly in the background I can hear " Sierra Pacfic 7..the rest lost in the pileup. According to my list " Sierra Papa " is the prefix of Poland. What a break, if I can make this contact it will be the first one from Poland for me. As I listened ,I realized that there was no way that I would get through the pileup with only 100 watts, but it was worth a try. After many minutes of trying to work this mess the DX op finally gave up and started calling for specific areas of North America. " I'm looking for only 0's and 5's".

This seemed to make no difference to stations wanting this contact, I heard everything from W6's,N1's, K4's and all in between. Seemed as if all the operators on that frequency had forgotten the first and maybe the most important rule... courtesy, guess few know what that word means in a pileup . One even went so far as to claim that the signal was fading in California andthen gave a rst of 59 and 20 over.

I can understand why some people have become dis-illusioned with "HAM" radio if we all act this way. I know everyone reading this has probably read and heard it all before, but until you experience it you can't fully understand why people would feel that way. Suppose everyone on that freq. had taken some time and in an orderly fashion to make their contact, maybe a few more could have been made.

After about an hour and half of this, the Dx gave up, took a break,

promising to come back . I decided it might be worth hanging around and waiting, maybe I would get in before the pileup begin again. Shortly the call came and I wasn't the only one that had this thought. As Qrz was called I got an immediate reply " Ocean yankee.. repeat your call please"

As I repeated my call and rst of 57, I asked that he repeat his call for the logbook. His call came back as "9 London 1 Baker Tango Baker on the island of Sierra Leone, rst 57, Qsl manager Sugar Papa 7 Baker Tango Baker ..QSL?" . Not long afterwards the band changed and all contact was lost.

You know....Sometimes it does pay to wait on better conditions after all..... 73 Mark KD5NOY

- 3910 LSB Louisiana Traffic Net (ARRL)
- 3925 LSB Alt. Emergency Frequncy and Gulf Coast SSB Network
- 3950 LSB National Hurricane Center Alternate frequency
- 7225 LSB Central Gulf Coast Net
- 7235 LSB Louisiana Emergency and Central Gulf hurricane Net
- 14325 USB National Hurrican Center Net
