Hello club members. I have a correction in regards to the change in dues proposed and approved in the last meeting. Mike Maston, N6OPH has pointed out that this would require a bylaw change to become effective. This change will be presented as a bylaw change at the soonest possible meeting. The budget that was proposed is so out of balance that the increase in dues is mandated. If we cannot get the budget balanced within the next year, we'll be in serious financial difficulty within 2 years. This may mean cutting events or requesting donations of those attending the events. The budget, which was approved at the meeting, is still under review to trim excess expenses. I would hope that the Santee Swap Meet continues to support us.

We will also be restoring the Crest repeater site in the next month or so. We are currently setting up the cabinet. This is going to cost the club about \$1200 more than has been donated to the FIRE FUND. Please be generous. If you send donations to the club, please use the P.O. General Membership Meeting 13 January 2005



The general membership meeting of the Amateur Radio Club of El Cajon was called to order by club president Michael "Stogie" Panger, KG6JCW at 1900hrs. After the pledge of allegiance visitors were welcomed.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** was approved as published.

TREASURER'S REPORT: was given by Mike, N6OPH in the absence of Susan, KF6WXA. It was approved as read and filed for audit. PRESIDENT: Stogie, KG6JCW announced the budget figures for the 2005 budget. There is at least a \$3726 difference between the expense and income. Stogie suggested that the dues should be increased from \$12 to \$20 for individual members and from \$20 to \$25 for family memberships. It was moved and seconded that the budget be approved. Motion was carried.

It was moved and seconded that the club dues be increased to \$20 for individual and \$25 for families. The increase would be effective immediately. Motion was carried. Duncan Campbell, KF61LA presented the program. It talked about his and wife's experiences during the typhoon of 2002 in Guam.

VICE PRESIDENT: David, KG6QCO mentioned that Skywarn may be the speaker for the February meeting. PAST PRESIDENT: Pat, WA6MHZ stated that there will be a ER meeting at the county EOC on Saturday. **SANDARC:** Mike, N6OPH announced that there are 22 positions on the 2006 convention committee and that 12 of those positions have been filled. Most of the volunteers came from the ARCEC.

He stated that he would be actively recruiting from other clubs. The convention will be held at the Marriott Mission Valley Hotel in September 2006. Mike also mentioned that Knick Knickerboker, K6SK has been diagnosed with congestive heart failure and needs to retire as the team leader of the El Cajon and South Bay sites. **EDUCATION:** Mike, N6OPH announced that the Technician class is now in progress. There are five students at present. The class will be held on both Tuesdays and Thursdays except for meeting nights. The general class will start sometime in March. Pat. WA6MHZ demonstrated some 1950's era radio equipment.

Michael, KG6TDP is a new member.

There being no further business before the general membership, the meeting was adjourned at 2115hrs.




