AMATEUR RADIO CLUB OF EL CAJON General membership meeting 13 May 2004

The general membership of the Amateur Radio Club of El Cajon was called to order by club president Michael "Stogie" Panger, KG6JCW at 1900hrs. After the pledge of alliance visitors were welcomed.

The **program** was presented by Tom, KC6NXZ. He spoke about NTS training and related topics.

SECRETARY'S report was read by Mike, N6OPH. It was approved as read.

TREASURER, Susan, KF6WXA gave the treasurer's report. It was approved as read and filed for audit.

Tuck, NZ6T the Southwestern Division Vice Director presented the ARRL Special Service Club certificate to the club, thus continuing the club tradition of service to the commu-

PRESIDENT Panger reported that the WAMO and other nets has been very poor turnout. New members/hams need to be trained and that is one of the reasons for the net. President is looking for people to help haul the equipment up the hill and to return down the hill for Field Day. There are a great many antennae and other equipment as well as food. Special Olympics will be held 5-6 June. We need at least 13 operators for the Sunday operations of the Olympics. Stogie asked the club members to support the prize table.

VICE PRESIDENT Tom, KC6NXZ reported that the program will be a presentation on this year's field day operation at the Al Bahr Shrine. Our field day chairman David, KG6QCO will be the speaker. Tom is also taking the names of those who wish to man the booth during the Del Mar Fair.

PAST PRESIDENT Pat, WA6MHZ reported on an upcoming disaster drill for 27 May.

MISCELEANEUS REPORTS: Mike, N6OPH reported that the next class will be CW which will be taught by Jeff, AB6NE. This class will start the third Tuesday in July at the El Cajon Firehouse at Lexington and Magnolia. This class should last six weeks.

The Special Olympics needs at least 13 operators for both Saturday and Sunday. The El Cajon Club usually hosts this event on Sunday. Contact Ken (Kazuo) Tagami, WA6BCC at 858-453-1829. Ask for Ken Jr. This event will occur on 5-6 June at San Diego State and Kroc Center.

Signups for the Del Mar fair are being requested for club days at the fair. The El Cajon Club will be hosting the SAN-

DARC exhibit from 11 to 14 June. There are three shifts per day. It is requested that at least two people work each shift with one being a general or higher license class.

Mike also reminded the club that a committee was formed in February to determine the possibility of relocating the Field Day site in 2005. Mike reported that he went to Rohr Park and Sweetwater Park. Rohr Park is much too small and does not allow any overnight camping. Sweetwater Park also does not allow overnight camping. Sweetwater would accommodate motor homes or campers. Mike pointed that would be fine for those who own motor homes or campers. Since this would preclude many club members. The committee will accept any suggestions from the membership. However, Mike stated that the committee would not make a recommendation until the location has been observed by Mike or other committee member. The committee will offer its report at the June meeting.

NET MANAGER David, KG6QCO looking for volunteers to help out with the various nets and needs people to participate during the net. This net meets every Wednesday and Saturday at 2000hrs. At the present time only about six club members check into this net.

SOCIAL chairman Xemi, KD6PRV is looking for cooking volunteers during field day. Please contact him at his home telephone at 619-574-0720. He would like at least two volunteers.

PRIZE Chair needs donations for quality prizes. The prize table is about \$22 in the hole. The quality of prizes has slipped greatly.

MEMBERSHIP chairman Joni, KF6MPB reported 216 members and the last WAMO is 1635. This number is lower than last months figure of 224 due to the fact that memberships now expire a year to date instead of 1 January.

TECHNICAL chairman Bob, W6RHV needs a site to place the repeaters. He is in the process of getting the systems up and running. There is still a need for cavities for the 220 machine.

SANDARC delegate Larry, AD6AV reported the election results. The slate was re-elected. He also reported that the USS Midway Association is not interested in a civilian amateur radio station aboard the ship at this time. Any radio station is about a year off. He also reported the Del Mar Fair signups are needed by the May SANDARC meeting. Kazuo, WA6BCC was awarded a plaque by SANDARC for his 20+ years service to amateur radio and the Special Olympics. Mike, N6OPH will be attending the NCVEC conference in July. The 2006 convention will be held the second weekend of September. Sybil, W6GIC has retired from SANDARC. She and her husband, London, W6SLF founded SANDARC in August of 1958.

Mike Lebo has asked that those members who can not attend the El Cajon Club Field day to attend his field day site near Montgomery Field.

The meeting was adjourned at 2020hrs.


