

Planning for JWFD

Wes is seeking helpers for 15th February (General Meeting day) to erect / test antennas.

He will be bringing his NVIS antenna that requires an area of 80' x 80'.

This will be a busy day.

Antennas / Project plans:

Base of tri-band tower needs re-affixing – ideal weather just now.

Steve outlined the plan to lever the plinth up (100 mm) and slide it clear of the bolts so that a 400mm x 400mm base of 18mm steel can be inserted under it. Gwynne has plans for its template. Jim and Wallace will get quotes.

The guys are not regarded as sufficiently reliable to support the mast because ground anchors are suspect.

A 2 x 8 antenna switch has been installed at HF2. Wes has designed a remotely controlled system for it.

A vote of thanks was proposed for this donation by Peter ZL1XA.

Antenna(s) for Yaesu FT736R at HF3 options are:

6 m dipole, extend the quad or Yagi and rotator on the Nally tower. There is enough cable for another run though the conduit.

The 60 m band cannot be used by the Branch. However Members can apply for a Sub Licence from NZART See NZART Infoline. A dipole needs legs of 44' each side.

The tower at Murrays Bay is ready to be taken down; then transported later from this difficult site.



Bouvet, 3Y0Z Cancelled

February 3, 2018, 2000 UTC: During the last 72 hours, we continued to experience the high winds, low clouds, fog and rough seas that have prevented helicopter operations since our arrival at Bouvet. No improvement was predicted in the weather forecast for the next four days. Then, last night, an issue developed in one of the ship's engines.



This morning, the captain of the vessel declared it unsafe to continue with our project and aborted the DXpedition. We are now on our long voyage back to Punta Arenas. As you might imagine, the team is deeply disappointed, but safe. There is already talk about rescheduling the DXpedition,

60m (5Mhz) Band access trial

NZART is pleased to announce that it has negotiated with RSM and the NZ Defence Force to obtain a licence to allow limited operation by ZL amateur operators on 60m on a trial basis.

The purpose of the trial is for RSM, NZART and primary users to investigate the ability for the amateur radio operators to operate on the frequencies of operation on a secondary basis without causing interference to primary users.

As the licence is held by NZART and the GURL which covers amateur bands does not include 60m, those who wish to operate on the band must complete and sign a <u>sub-licence</u> form which sets out the terms of operation and return it to NZART.

This is then to be scanned and emailed to Debby at NZART: nzart@nzart.org.nz. Please check that you fill out the entire form, including 'Schedule A' on the third page to avoid delays in processing.


Once she acknowledges receipt you can begin operation. Operation centres on 5353 kHz and 5362 - 5364 kHz with a maximum output of 10 dBW e.i.r.p.

Once you have this acknowledgement you will also have your Callsign and Name listed on the <u>sub-licence</u> <u>holders list</u> linked to the right.

There are some <u>FAQs</u> linked to the right which we strongly suggest you read before you start to ensure you stay within the rules.

We hope you enjoy these new privileges.

NZART 60M Trial Update

NZART & the 60m team has been delighted with the uptake and support from the ZL amateur community.

The first few days of operation while obviously a new experience for everyone, has highlighted some areas that we need to address.

As you know we have access to two channels, 5353 kHz which is SSB only and 5362 kHz which is a mixture of CW, digimodes (less than 100 Hz in bandwidth) and SSB.

With regard to digimodes, the only modes that can be used must be less than 100 Hz in bandwidth (as negotiated with RSM). This so far has mainly meant JT9 and FT8 although any other mode less than 100 Hz wide is welcome (such as PSK-31). However to be clear this rules out JT65, and RTTY. Some EU stations have taken to trying to call us using JT65. Please do not respond and they will eventually get the message (or post on the DX cluster telling them that).

In terms of 5362 kHz it has become clear that DX operation is possible in the hours before and after sunrise and sunset. This has been predominantly using FT8, JT9 and CW. EU has the ability to call us on 5362 kHz, the US does not. Some US stations have tried to work us split by transmitting on 5357 kHz. In this instance you need to be careful in going split to make sure you are transmitting on 5362 kHz (there has been the odd occasion where this has not happened).

Because of the mixture of modes allowed, it has also become clear we need to further regulate how 5362 kHz is being used as it has been very busy and certain modes are more effective than others at certain times. Accordingly to ensure this frequency is used in an orderly fashion and taking into account the DX windows, we are proposing the following bandplan:

5362.05 kHz - 5362.75 kHz CW 5362.8 kHz - 5364.75 kHz digital modes (less 100 Hz bandwidth) 5362 kHz SSB (USB)*

*During the periods between 0500 -1200 UTC & 1600 - 2200 UTC SSB is NOT to be used. If you wish to use SSB during these times the 5353 kHz channel is still available.

Please note:

- 1. If DX stations call outside of this plan we ask that you do not call them on their frequency but stay within the plan above.
- 2. PLEASE listen (or watch your waterfall) carefully before you transmit. If the frequency is in use then moderate you behaviour accordingly. If for example SSB is being used on 5362 kHz outside the DX period then do not use CW or digimodes until the channel is clear. Likewise if CW or FT8 is being used then do not use SSB until the frequency is clear.
- 3. We would encourage digimode operators to use all of their allocation rather than congregating below "2000" on their waterfalls.

NZART is working with RSM on obtaining a further 60m allocation which we hope will alleviate some of the congestion on 5362 kHz. We will advise further as negotiations progress.
