Turn the DRL 146.880 or 146.640 repeater net mode on - Enter on keypad:

- 1. Calling the Arapahoe County District 22 Amateur Radio Emergency Service Information Net. Calling the Arapahoe County District 22 A. R. E. S. Information Net.
- 2. This is WAØRES as Net Control Station,
- 3. I am located in _____. My name is _____
- 4. This is a directed Net conducted by the Arapahoe County District 22 Amateur Radio Emergency Service. This Net is held each Sunday at 0930 local time on the repeater frequency of 146.88 with primary backup frequency 146.64, courtesy of the Denver Radio League, or the 147.12 repeater with a PL tone of 88.5 as the secondary backup frequency, courtesy of the Aurora Repeater Association. This net is conducted in plain English. Please, no "Q" signals and use standard ITU phonetics. (Please indicate if the repeater is not in net mode.)
- 5. Any station with PRIORITY or EMERGENCY traffic, please call now. (Pause for any emergency check-ins.)
- 6. If there is an emergency during this net, use the word "BREAK". The net will be suspended until the emergency traffic has been handled.
- 7. All stations checking in are requested to remain on frequency until dismissed by Net Control. At this time, please check in with your call sign, name, and location. Please indicate if you have traffic or comments.
 - A. (Log each check-in, acknowledge each in a "group" before going to the next group.)
 - ✓ Stations with suffixes beginning "A" (alpha) through "F" (foxtrot), please call now.
 - ✓ Stations with suffixes beginning "A" (alpha) through "L" (lima), please call now.
 - ✓ Stations with suffixes beginning "A" (alpha) through "R" (romeo), please call now.
 - ✓ Stations with suffixes beginning "A" (alpha) through "Z" (zulu), please call now.
 - B. <u>After roll call</u>, call each station that has indicated traffic or comments in the order they checked in.

- 12. All stations are encouraged and invited to check into the Colorado Section A.R.E.S. HF Net which is held every Sunday morning on 75 meters (voice), at 3928 kHz, at Ø8ØØ local time, the HF Digital Net, which is held on the 1st and 3rd Sunday's at 3590 KHz mark, the CW net which is held each 2nd and 4th Sundays at 07:30 at 3570 KHz, the Colorado VHF SSB Net held on Mondays at 1900 on 144.220 MHz, and the Colorado Section VHF Net held every Sunday morning at Ø83Ø on the Colorado Connection Repeater System; the 2-Meter frequency of 145.31 with PL tone of 123. The purpose of the District 22 A.R.E.S. Net is to provide information of interest to the members on recently completed activities and upcoming events. The Net also provides training opportunities under non-emergency conditions. All members should participate frequently in running the weekly Net to develop confidence and ease with running this or <u>any</u> net. You won't be in shell shock in the event an actual emergency arises and YOU are appointed to be the NCS!

Nervous? No need to pull your hair out ... Everyone who calls the net had to have a first time. We've all made mistakes or lost his or her way in the script (and that includes the "seasoned" folks!). That's why you are encouraged to use the net as training time.



Prepare! Have your script, a pad or log sheet, two or more pens or pencils, and your radio ready to go before net time arrives (are the batteries fully charged? Yup, we've even had dying batteries happen!). Take your time, and RELAX. These nets do NOT have to be all serious, but should be run with control by you. This does not mean it can't be a "fun" net!

One of the important things to learn as a Net Control Station is to get information recorded correctly and accurately. If you are unsure of a call sign or name, ask for that information to be repeated. Ask for phonetics if necessary. Again, good training.

Don't have a script? Not a problem! The script is provided only as a guideline to help you through the net call-up. If necessary, adlib and ask if you left anything out before closing the net.

Following the net, report the number of check-ins to the Emergency Coordinator. He will, in turn, report this information in a monthly report to the District EC.

Net Control, the Operations Manager, or your Team Leader will typically request volunteers during a net session to run the nets for the upcoming month they are responsible for. Jump in with both feet and volunteer! Your support is needed and if EVERYone took a turn, you would probably run a net only twice a year at most.

If you have questions, call an Officer, your Team Leader, or just ask during a net after you have checked in. You will always find someone that can help!
