One last note: You know Mary and I have "PTL" call signs. One of our twin grandsons, Josiah, in Illinois is now the owner of K0PTL.



Our Christian brother Lawrence "Larry" Hodge (W2PT) became a new and valued member of the "Arms Glory Net" on Sunday, September 29th 2019. I can only imagine the joyful welcome in heaven that Larry has received by those many ARMS individuals who are already there! The QRN, QRM, and QSB will give way to "perfect contacts" and a never-ending "eyeball QSO" with the "ultimate ARMS President", Jesus Christ!

Larry grew up in the village of Ames, New York near Canajoharie. He was a graduate of Houghton College and Asbury Theological Seminary. Larry was a longtime pastor of numerous churches in the Binghamton, New York area and was a Chief Engineer for a number of radio for nearly 30 years.

Larry's God-given technical expertise' & broadcasting skills reached far beyond New York! He made several radio missions trips to Haiti, Bolivia, Colombia, and some Caribbean countries, as well. He was often asked to help "troubleshoot" technical problems and set up radio stations in Central New York and Northern Pennsylvania.

Larry was loved and respected by his colleagues, fellow broadcasters, and ARMS members. He was quick to help and stayed to make sure you were not left alone until things were working properly. At all hours of the day and night including holidays and in all kinds of weather he was called on to keep his radio stations on the air and operating as they should be. He was constantly helping fellow "hams" (including myself) with their equipment issues and he did it for free!

Larry and his "XYL" Patsy hosted many memorable ARMS picnics over the years. Their humor, laughter, and hospitality made everyone feel welcome!

Larry was the Conklin Youth Commissioner for several years and umpired hundreds of softball and baseball games in the spring and summer months. He loved to watch his two sons Tom and Tim play football and baseball and his daughter Debbie star for the Susquehanna Valley championship softball teams and then at the University of Albany. When Debbie's teams traveled to places like California and Florida, he was there to offer support. He loved his family and was proud of them!


I met Larry at Houghton College in 1963. He introduced me to Patsy's sister Sandy at their 1971 wedding. At the time I didn't realize that Sandy and I would be married 4 years later! My Heavenly Father, earthly father, and Larry had other "ideas!" They gave me some good advice which, after 44 years of marriage, I'm glad I followed!

As I write this, many memories flood my mind! I fondly recall our many on air QSO's, marathon sessions of Rook ("Wesleyan Poker") with Houghton College buddies, the kindness showed to me by his parents Merle and Alice Hodge when I visited their home, and the Houghton House League Basketball Team ("The 73's") that we were a part of. We didn't win many games but we had "tons of fun!"

Perhaps the best memory of Larry I will cherish is his help and encouragement when I was seriously ill with cancer in late 2006 and early 2007. Though Larry was terminally ill, he again encouraged me this past summer when I had a prolonged illness and stuck with me as I slowly recovered with encouraging "telephone QSO's!"

During Larry's final week of life, he continued to share Christ's love with those who visited him in the hospital including his doctors and nurses. Larry was unashamed of Christ's Gospel, was a good and faithful servant of Jesus and lived a life that yielded a harvest of souls for God's Kingdom! My words fail but Christ's words say it all: "Well done, Larry Hodge, good and faithful servant!" 73's, 88's, 99's


Charles Cox—K7AQ



A Note from the Secretary/Treasurer


ARMS membership runs from June 1 of one year to May 31 of the following year.

Central Asia

Pray for the ministries of several organizations working in Central Asia. In many areas, conventional mission work is not allowed.

Creative methods need to be used and media becomes even more important. People are responding to the Gospel, and radio has become an important tool for discipleship.

Pray that God's love shows through those working to reach the several language groups in the area.


South Asia

Reach Beyond Australia and Reach Beyond New Zealand, along with its international partner Gospel Youth Mission, , are collaborating to develop a new internet radio ministry to the people of Pakistan. Launched in mid-October, this Urdu language radio station broadcasts the message of Jesus Christ to the people of Pakistan directly to their mobiles phones, computers and smart TVs. Sachai Radio is an app-based radio station which utilizes a cloud-based server and station infrastructure. Its format is like a traditional radio station, but available anywhere on the Internet.

Urdu is the national language of Pakistan, also spoken in parts of India, Bangladesh, Nepal and the Middle East. In Pakistan alone, there are 100 million Urdu speakers. Sachai Radio's programs originate in Pakistan but stream from New Zealand. Pakistan's Gospel Youth Mission is especially known for its sports evangelism programs and also reach out through children's Sunday school programs, live drama, village video screenings, and a Bible literacy correspondence program.

"Cloud and app-based radio is making it possible to spread the Gospel to areas that are culturally and politically difficult to access." said Bob Arend, Reach Beyond's New Zealand Director.

Pray for this new joint initiative to share the Gospel with those who need to hear.
