Our next meeting will be June 4, 2020 at 7:00 P.M.



At this time there has been no word on when we will be able to use the conference rooms at BRMC again.


We will not have a meeting or newsletter in July. Please see below for information about Field Day.

- If you are outside the repeater coverage area and do not have wires-x you can participate via YouTube chat or Net logger AIM.
- The Bristol-ARC wires-x room will be switched to analog for the meeting.

- Any votes that need to be taken will be done in a roll call fashion. The current roster will be available to verify membership.

# Field Day 2020 A Different Kind of Year

As we roll into early June, we are usually planning on our club Field Day activity from one of our local parks, how many HF station will we have, what kind of antennas, and most importantly what kind of good food and fellowship we will be having. However, COVID 19 has changed all of that for this year. In light of us not being able to gather in persons for Field Day, the ARRL has encouraged folks to operate from home by allowing stations in the 1D class to count contacts with each other. This is not typically the norm. With this special exception to the rule this year, they are allowing folks to operate from home and submit their scores for the club. This is exciting due to the fact that this may spurn some of us to try a new antenna at home or a new mode like FT8. It might encourage you to operate 6 meters. A 6-meter dipole is easy to put up and is small. This should add more local activity to 6 which is exciting. As Tom Shutters has said, by getting on and operating you will learn a wealth about the real capabilities of your station from radios, antennas, and computers connected to radios.

So, in this time of social distancing we will do the responsible thing but also maintain the fun spirit of Field Day as we put together a big group of logs to submit with our club's name on them. We will submit under the name Bristol (TN) ARC. There are many logging programs out there that support logging for Field Day. I would suggest looking for one that is easy to use for you and what you want to do. I am always available if you have any questions.
