Status of our Communications Vehicle: At our business meeting in March we discussed the communications vehicle that we received from the CBJ. As you recall we received the generous gift of the

used ambulance that was surplus to the needs of the CBJ. At the time we received title to the ambulance, it was our hope that it could be converted to a Club Communication vehicle for use at training events and during actual emergencies. As we considered the long-term possibilities and expenses, it began to look as though the expense of just maintaining insurance and regular maintenance of the vehicle could exceed our Club's financial capability even if we were able to obtain grants for conversion and equipping of the vehicle. Following are the main points and options offered by Club members:

- ! We can sell the vehicle and use the money from the sale to equip a small trailer. The trailer wouldn't carry the high annual costs associated with the truck and could be hauled by Club members to the location of use. Storage would be simplified and vehicle insurance wouldn't be needed.
- ! The money could be used for maintenance and upgrading of our existing repeater network that would directly benefit Club members and the CBJ.
- ! We could retain title to the truck and work at getting long-term grants to cover annual ownership expenses. This is possible, but no one to date has come forward to pursue this option. The question would still remain if this were a good use of the Club's scarce financial resources.

We will discuss this issue at the meeting on Wednesday evening and hope to make a decision at that time. If you can't be at the meeting contact Sam Smith on Tuesday or Wednesday.
