March 21, 1996

The meeting was called to order by President Al Staples N7VOF. Members and guests present introduced themselves.

Announcements: Al stated that since he had not had any volunteers to take over as Program Chairman, he was going to take over that function. In that capacity he appointed a different individual to take responsibility for each month the rest of this year. Those responsible are: Al N7VOF April and June, John Black W7HIL May, Stuart Whiting KB7UUX July, Herschel Whiting WS7K August, Bob Adams KJ7BP September, Jim Hossack V7LS October, and Jerry Sampont WA7BUY November.

Minutes of the February 15 meeting, as published in SPARKS, were approved.

John Black V7HIL was appointed to purchase what might be useful for the trailer to use up a \$20 credit we have at an electronics house, since it has been on their books a long time and needs to be used.

The Treasurers Report, as published in SPARKS, was discussed and it was stated by the Secretary Jim Von Seggern KC7FEH that since the newsletter is mailed to other people/places than just our membership, he did not feel it appropriate that all the numbers should be published in SPARKS. The full report is certainly available to any member who requests it. There did not appear to be any dissent, so the Treasurer's Report will continue the informal format.
